

CLASS SPECIFICATION

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

This is a competitive class trainee position. The period of trainee service shall be not less than one year and not more than two years from the date of appointment from an appropriate eligible list, the service to be of such designated length as to satisfy the training and experience requirements for Forensic Medical Photographer I. Upon the satisfactory completion of the designated trainee service, which also serves as the probationary period, a Forensic Medical Photographer Trainee shall attain permanent status as Forensic Medical Photographer I.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under direct supervision, uses limited judgment in assisting Forensic Medical Photographers and receives training in the operation of various types of photographic and videotaping equipment, including digital imaging devices; performs related duties as required.

TYPICAL DUTIES

1. Learns and assists in taking photographs of deceased persons, including anatomical structures and pathological specimens, and digital processing of images.
2. Learns and assists in producing photos of various stages of progress of autopsy.
3. Learns and assists in photographing autopsy specimens for record or investigations.
4. Learns and assists in reproducing radiographs, charts, graphs, medical art work, and processing of film/digital images.
5. Learns and assists in performing photomicrography, including time-lapse studies.
6. Learns and assists in maintaining photographic files and indexes.
7. Learns and assists in producing medical illustrations, charts, and graphs.
8. Archives digital images using a variety of database management software.

*ADA ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

1. Knowledge of the equipment, techniques, and materials used in forensic medical photography.
- 2 Knowledge of black and white, and color film processing, and digital image processing.

3. Ability to operate and use various types of photographic equipment.
4. Ability to produce and edit images that accomplish forensic medical objectives.
5. Ability to record, organize, and present photographic material accurately.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience

1. Completion of a two-year curriculum in photography at a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university;

or

2. Completion of a program of full-time instruction in photography at a commercial school registered by the New York State Department of Education or an out-of-state branch of that school

and

One year of satisfactory experience as a paid photographer;

or

3. Graduation from high school

and

Two years of satisfactory experience as a paid photographer.
