CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, Chairman.

Legislator Seth Koslow?
LEGISLATOR KOSLOW: Here.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Thank you, Mr.

We actually have an Addendum. So first thing I'm going to do is make a motion to suspend the Rules.

(Whereupon, all members of the Finance Committee respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Motion is passed.
We're now first going to begin with
those items which had already been discussed in other committees. And we will take this on consent. So they are Items 45, 46, 47, 48, 50, 56 and 59.

Motion by Legislator Kennedy and second by Legislator Davis.

Any discussion on those items?



CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Now we are going
to go on to items on the Addendum. There
is one item not on the addendum which
we're going to discuss which will be Item 49 which is a resolution to authorize a transfer budget appropriations for 2024.

So moved by Legislator Walker, second by Legislator Koslow.

MS. ZOHRABIAN: Good afternoon. Alyssa Zohrabian, Health Department.

Item 49-24 contains three board
transfers to maximize grant funding. The
first one is in the amount of $\$ 36,569$, and that is for the Immunization Action Grant. Savings and fringe and general expense will be utilized to cover salary.

The second one is in the amount of $\$ 78,142$, and that is for the ELC Reopening Schools Grant. Funds saved in salary will be used to cover additional indirect costs.

The third is in the amount of $\$ 601$. And that is for the Child Fatality Grant.


Funds saved in travel will cover pension and fringe. All three programs are 100\% grant funded.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any discussion among the legislators?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any public
comment?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: That being said, all in favor signify by saying, "Aye."
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye". )
CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Passed unanimously, 7-0.


CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: We'll now go on to Item 60-24, amending Ordinance 543 of 1995 with respect to salaries and benefits for non-contract employees of the County.

Motion, please. Moved by Legislator Ferretti, seconded by Legislator Solages.

This is Item 60-24. And now we'll have Mr. Persich.

MR. PERSICH: Good afternoon. Andy Persich, Office of Management and Budget.

This item is amending the ordinance, for lack of a better thing, for ordinance employees to allow them to participate in the 401a, which we've established for all the collective bargaining units. It provides a, for lack of a better thing, a tax savings to both the employee and the employer in this matter. We've amended the rules so that you have to be 55 and older to participate. And we're going from a three payout to a single payout for ordinance employees.


CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Mr. Persich, just a couple of questions. So this is going to be a mandatory requirement, not an option on behalf of the employee, correct?

MR. PERSICH: That is correct. If you're 55 and older, you have to be participating in the plan. If you're 55 and younger than that, you do not.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: I'm just curious as to the reason behind. Because we have some employees would like to have that instant payout at that point. Just wondering the reasoning you say there's tax savings. Will you explain to us as the basis behind this?

MR. PERSICH: We had to set
boundaries because we had to set the rules as what was defined by the vendor, and these were the rules that we came up that we thought was beneficial not only to the employee and to the employer. It's not a thought process. There's certain restrictions that do apply as far

as withdrawals and everything else. They can have access to the money, but what they will have is a tax benefit because it immediately benefits them from paying FICA taxes on that money. So you dump it in there, you take it out. If you withdraw it already, depending upon your taxable situation, you'll pay the 10\% penalty to withdraw it. But there is a benefit to the employee as a result of this.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: You're saying it's savings on the FICA. If we didn't do that, they'd have to pay the FICA on this.

MR. PERSICH: They would have to pay the FICA. You can cover up to I want to say it's 130,000 somewhere in that range of deferring that FICA amount. So there is a big benefit to some of these payouts as it gets larger. But for ordinance employees, there's not too many that are going to reach those boundaries.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any further
discussion among the legislators?
Legislator Ferretti, please.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Hi, Mr.
Persich.
MR. PERSICH: Good afternoon.
LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Can you just go a little further? What is the benefit to the employer, tax purposes?

MR. PERSICH: We don't have to pay the FICA portion of it. The employee and the employer do not have to pay the 7.625\% of that of the FICA taxes. With the other unions, we will see a benefit of it. The sworn services were the ones who actually actively asked us to do this. So we implemented it as a result of that. But there is some savings to the County as a result of that. So we will save FICA taxes on our side.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: And if you terminate your employment prior to reaching the age 55, then nothing changes.

MR. PERSICH: Nothing changes.

You'll get one payout as opposed to the three payouts that we used to have the standard, which was $\$ 5,000$, which I think considering the County's fiscal position, it's a logistical nightmare to do those three pays for certain people. So this provides us a little bit more easier bookkeeping for that too.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: And for an employee who terminates and this money does go into this account, what age must they reach before they can remove the money without penalty?

MR. PERSICH: They can remove it whenever they want to.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Without
penalty.
MR. PERSICH: Depending upon the taxable situation.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: So there's no set date. It depends on the circumstances.

MR. PERSICH: For lack of a better thing, it's a branch off of the 457 Plan
is really what this is. And then the same rules and requirements will be under the IRS regulations will be in place for those people.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Okay. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any further
discussion from the legislators?
(Whereupon, no verbal

Item 61-24 is a subrecipient agreement with the Village of Farmingdale, and the amount of $\$ 1$ million using ARPA funds to assist in their water improvement systems to help treat the 1,4-Dioxane. The \$1 million comes from the $\$ 15$ million allocation from ARPA that was passed back in January.
