Measures



- Applications for public assistance programs have decreased in 2017 with a large proportion of Medicaid applications (MAGI) to be transitioned over to NY State of Health in the following years (Phase IV, June 2017) as per NYS Medicaid Redesign
- The unemployment rate slowly inched up but was still higher than in 2007
- Child abuse reports and specifically reports with allegations of physical abuse and corporal excessive punishment continues to slowly decrease from 2010
- The number of Domestic Violence incidents reported to the NCPD are down, the number of police Domestic Violence arrests are trending downward as well
- Domestic Violence arrests with a referral to CPS have been trending downward since 2010
- The number of victims receiving Domestic Violence services from *TSCLI in 2017 increased 39% over 2015 levels, increasing 21% in 2016 over 2015
- The number of victims referred through TSCLI Police Project decreased 34% in 2017 from 2014 and the number of victims contacted increased 88% from 2015
- After a steady increase from 2010 to 2013 (32%), hotline calls have declined by 8%





Domestic Violence and Public Benefits


- Applications for public benefits rose aggressively from 2007 to 2011. During the 2012-2017 time period new SNAP and PA applications have stabilized and decreased. MA applications (MAGI) were to be taken over by the NY State of Health in 2017



Domestic Violence -Unemployment

- From 2007 to 2012 the unemployment rate in Nassau increased +3.3% from 3.7% to 7.0%. Since 2012 the unemployment rate decreased -3.1% to 3.9% in 2016 and an increase to 4.1% in 2017, but is still higher than the 2007 low of 3.7%

Yearly Average Nassau County Unemployment Rate




Domestic Violence – Physical Abuse

- Physical Abuse Allegations have Decreased 15% since 2010

- “Excessive Corporal Punishment” has dropped -29% since 2010


CPS Reports Allegations of Physical Abuse for Excessive Corporal Punishment

- DV Reports to the NCPD decreased -10% from 2010 to 2017


Domestic Violence Reports to NCPD



Domestic Violence – NCPD Arrests

- DV Arrests by the NCPD decreased -39% by the end of 2017 from a high in 2009


Domestic Violence Arrests By NCPD



DV Arrest with a Referral to CPS

- DV arrests with a referral to CPS increased 172% to a high water mark of 307 in 2010. Since 2010, it has been steadily decreasing (-48%) to 161 by the end of 2017

Domestic Violence – TSCLI

- The number of unduplicated victims of domestic violence receiving DV services from TSCLI increased by 21% from 2012 to 2014, and has now increased 13% in 2017 from 2014 averaging approximately 3,700 victims per year over 8 years

Domestic Violence Victims - TSCLI*





Domestic Violence Police Project

- The number of unduplicated victims reported through the Police Project decreased -34% in 2017 from 2014, and the number of victims contacted increased by 88% in 2017 over 2015


TSCLI Police Project Contacts
