On behalf of County Executive Tom Suozzi and Commissioner James J Callahan III thank you for your dedication and commitment to CERT and Citizen Preparedness.

We have set a date for the Citizen Corps Volunteer Recognition Dinner, [March 10, 2010](#). At this time we do not have any details except the date! Please keep checking the brief for additional information!

Remember the 3 H's: What to have in your home, what to have in your hand, and what to have in your head! And of course if you have all this you will be able to respond to help the rest of the community as a CERT!

I would like to take this opportunity as we prepare for another year of CERT activities to mention some of our many accomplishments:

- We have 929 fully trained active CERT volunteers
- Since 2004 we have trained 15,789 Individuals in emergency preparedness and family safety
- We have logged over 18,000 volunteer hours this year (between January 1 and September 30) for administrative, activation and training efforts
- 48 Activations Including:
 - Presidential Debate at Hofstra University, October 2008
 - Swine Flu— manned phone bank, April 2009
 - ARC Shelter Exercise—assisted with set up, shelter operation and role played as clients, May 2008
 - Tested evacuation route on south shore, June 2008
 - IKEA Mall Terrorism Drill (multidiscipline/multijurisdictional)—assisted with moulage, role playing victims and staffed the canteen; September 2008
 - EOC winter storm activation
- Participate in the Transit Terrorism Techniques and Tactics (4T) training – portrayed commuters for practical exercise of trainees, 2008 & 2009 to assist first responders

- June 2008 presented with the Good Neighbor Award by Nassau County ARC

FEMA Administrator Fugate Meets With HBCU Leadership To Discuss Partnership In Preparedness

FEMA Administrator Craig Fugate addresses presidents, provosts, chancellors, and deans from a number of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) from across the country at FEMA's Emergency Management Institute (EMI) in Emmitsburg, Md. The meeting -- part of the second offering of an Emergency Management Planning, Preparedness, Training and Education Workshop for Colleges and Universities -- is designed to provide schools and their leadership with an introduction to emergency management, a basic overview of EMI's higher education programs and an opportunity to hear from leading professionals in the field of emergency management.

[FBI Releases Preliminary Semiannual Crime Statistics for 2009](#)

In its Preliminary Semiannual Uniform Crime Report released on December 21st, the FBI indicated that the volume of violent crime in the nation decreased 4.4 percent and the volume of property crime declined 6.1 percent. More than 11,700 law enforcement agencies contributed to this report, which is based on information from law enforcement agencies that provided three to six common months of data to the FBI from January to June of both 2008 and 2009...

[Dec. 26, 2009, Marks Five Years Since Sumatra Indonesia Tsunami Killed 230,000](#)

In December 2004, lack of an effective international warning system contributed to unprecedented loss of life when a tsunami devastated countless communities around the Indian Ocean and stunned the rest of the world. Through NOAA, the United States accelerated preparation for a potential tsunami along the U.S. coastline and efforts to build partnerships for an international warning program. According to NOAA tsunami experts, the key to surviving a destructive tsunami is people's ability to receive warnings and willingness to act quickly to move inland or to higher ground. “NOAA is advancing tsunami science and warning systems for America and many at-risk parts of the world,” said Jane Lubchenco, Ph.D., under secretary of commerce for oceans and atmosphere and NOAA administrator. “Our efforts cannot stop with researching, developing technology and issuing forecasts – successful early warning ultimately relies on communicating the threat clearly so a prepared population will be able to act responsibly.”

[Amateur Radio Bill Passes Senate, Moves to the House](#)

n Monday, December 14, S 1755 -- The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009 -- passed the Senate by unanimous consent; the bill now goes to the House of Representatives for consideration. Sponsored by Senator Joe Lieberman (ID-CT), and Senator Susan Collins (R-ME), S 1755, if passed, would direct the DHS to undertake a study on emergency communications. S 1755 points out that "There is a strong Federal interest in the effective performance of Amateur Radio Service stations, and that performance must be given -- (A) support at all levels of government; and (B) protection against unreasonable regulation and impediments to the provision of the valuable communications provided by such stations."
