- 6 LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN MUSCARELLA: Motion by
- 8 Ms. Schaefer, seconded by Mr. Kennedy. The
- 9 item is before us.
- 10 MR. SALLEY: Sean Salley, Nassau
- 11 County Department of Public Works. This is
- 12 a supplemental appropriation in the amount
- of \$476,334 for the Unified Planning Work
- 14 Program funded by the FTA as part of the
- 15 New York Metropolitan Transportation
- 16 Planning Council federal transportation
- 17 planning and infrastructure work.
- This money is essentially used to
- 19 provide funding support for Nassau County to
- 20 conduct transportation planning related
- 21 work. It also funds what they call core
- 22 activities which include the preparing the
- 23 transportation improvement program which
- 24 essentially earmarks federal funding for
- 25 projects like resurfacing.

2	So all of the staff time that is
3	charged to that work is essentially
4	reimbursed or some of it which is reimbursed
5	by this funding.
6	Traffic studies are partially
7	funded through this funding. The planning
8	work program is required by the FTA and FHWA
9	to receive the implementation funds, the
10	construction funds that we receive.
11	This is an annual program. This
12	money would be eligible April 2019 through
13	March 2020.
14	CHAIRMAN MUSCARELLA: Any
15	questions?

- 9 the Department of Parks, Recreation and
- 10 Museums, and Item 244, supplemental to the
- 11 annual appropriation ordinance in connection
- 12 with the Department of Public Works,
- 13 Recreation and Museums. Motion, please.

- 20 Eileen Krieb, Commissioner of Parks.
- 21 The first is 242 of '19. This is
- 22 a \$1.7 million anticipated revenue for
- 23 Mitchell Field. Their funds for 2019 to be
- 24 appropriated and credited to the department
- 25 code as indicated.

- 2 243-19 is a supplemental
- 3 appropriation for Hotel Motel for 2019's
- 4 fiscal year. That represents eight percent
- 5 of the total funds to be received for
- 6 historic building restoration.
- 7 244-'19 is a supplemental
- 8 appropriation for fiscal year 2019. This
- 9 item appropriates an additional amount of
- 10 funds for year end. Again it's allocated to
- 11 the department codes as described.
- 12 CHAIRMAN MUSCARELLA: Any
- 13 questions? Legislator Bynoe.
- 14 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Thank you,
- 15 Chair. I'm sorry, could you give us a
- 16 little more details about those department
- 17 numbers?
- I can see them and I know they
- 19 are GRT, PK89, but can you specifically tell
- 20 me what those accounts are?
- 21 MS. KRIEB: 89 is Mitchell Field,
- 22 PK89. Those are the funds, the revenue
- 23 generated at Mitchell Field. Per the
- 24 agreement with the Navy, all those revenues
- 25 that are generated stay with the property.

- 2 That's what the \$1.7 million is.
- 3 Then attached to that, we have
- 4 allocated to it specific departments, AA is
- 5 salaries. AB is benefits. BB and DD are,
- 6 one is general services and the other is
- 7 equipment and DD is contractual services.
- 8 They are divided out into how the expenses
- 9 are generated within the Mitchell complex.
- 10 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Very good.
- 11 The last item 244-19.
- MS. KRIEB: This number,
- 13 \$2,266,931 represents 75 percent of the
- 14 money generated from the total amount
- 15 received for Hotel Motel. And, again, I'm
- 16 not sure what document you are seeing, but
- 17 AA is salaries, AB is benefits, and DE is
- 18 programs.
- 19 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: That's for
- 20 parks?
- MS. KRIEB: For parks. Large
- 22 amounts of money used by the parks
- 23 department and by the legislation is
- 24 dictated how it's used.
- 25 CHAIRMAN MUSCARELLA: Any other
