LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you.
There are five items on the agenda today which are clerk items 58-20, 59-20, 60-20, 70-20 and 71-20. Clerk items 58-20 through 60-20 and 71 are ordinances supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the health department. And item 70-20 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with Human Services.

May I have a motion please. By
Legislator Schaefer. Seconded by Legislator Drucker.

MS. LAURAIN: Good afternoon.
Mary Ellen Laurain, Department of Health.
Item 58-20 is a supplemental
appropriation in the amount of $\$ 418,578$.
Sorry. I was running. This is for the tuberculosis program. This is grant funded

through New York State Department of Health, and the mission is to protect the public against tuberculosis.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any
legislative comments? Next item.
MS. LAURAIN: Item 59-20 is a
supplemental appropriation. It's in the amount of $\$ 20,360$. It's for our rabies program. It's 100 percent funded through the New York State Department of Health and its mission is to protect the public against rabies.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any
legislative comments? 60-20.
MS. LAURAIN: $60-20$ is a supplemental appropriation. It's in the amount of $\$ 294,343$. It's for the Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act. This is funded through New York State Department of Health and does inspections and compliance for tobacco sales to people less than 21 years of age.

I see the backup. I just spoke to our fiscal unit to make sure they do change

the backup. The law went into effect in November. I will make sure they change the backup to 21. The state still calls it though the adolescent tobacco. They have not changed that name. I did ask that question but they have not changed that yet.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Could I just
ask, Mary Ellen, if you could submit that backup to the clerk please.

MS. LAURAIN: For this item or
just for the next grant cycle?
LEGISLATOR WALKER: For this
item. Between now and the full leg just so we have the updated.

MS. LAURAIN: Sure we will do
that. Yes.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Just throwing
something else on your plate that you have to worry about.

MS. LAURAIN: That's quite okay.
I understand.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you.
Legislator Drucker.
LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Thank you

Madam Chairwoman. We worked pretty hard to get the tobacco age raised to 21 . It is important to get that changed. Any possibility of getting it to include checking for licenses for vaping retailers?

MS. LAURAIN: We are doing that. We do compliance checks for vape. You mean in the backup?

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: There's $\$ 294,000$ that's funded. Can it be included while they're checking these places they're probably the same places that sell the vape products.

MS. LAURAIN: We do check that. Yes, we do.

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Will it be listed all as one of the things that's certified?

MS. LAURAIN: We would have to check with the state health department as far as when they send us the award letter. I'd have to look into that.

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Can you do that?

MS. LAURAIN: Yes.
LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: And let us know?

MS. LAURAIN: Yes.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you.
Any other legislators?
MS. LAURAIN: That was 60,
right? Item 71-20 is a supplemental
appropriation in the amount of $\$ 155,000$ and that is for the HIV expanded service grant. This is funded through New York State Department of Health and the mission is to find people who may not be in care who are infected with HIV and encourage them back into care.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions
from the legislators or comments?
MS. LAURAIN: Back to the
tobacco. There are stings being conducted.
We've done them with the police and state police for vape.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you very much for that. Thank you. And is there anyone here from the administration to speak

on item 70-20?
MS. HORST: Katy Horst from the administration. I'm going to do my best.

This item appropriates $\$ 348,395$ in
funds received from the New York State Office for the Aging for the period of April 1, 2019 through March 31, 2020. The new name of this program is Unmet Needs. It is a new revenue source that is meant to supplement other already existing programs such as transportation or housing. The OFA plans on running a pilot program for the transportation program for the senior population. This would provide rides for seniors who need to travel to the doctor, pharmacy and other designations. It's 100 percent reimbursable. LEGISLATOR WALKER: This would cover all of our seniors?

MS. HORST: That is all the information I have but $I$ can get back to you. LEGISLATOR WALKER: If you could. Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: If you could also, I don't expect you to have it,

I'm wondering what kind of vehicles it's going to cover? We had an incident where we tried to get a bus to help in Port Washington and it wasn't handicapped accessible. Is this going to go through the NICE system with Able Ride? I know you don't know. If you could just let us know what type of vehicle and how it's going to be distributed. Thank you.

Schaefer.
LEGISLATOR SCHAEFER: I just agree. I want to reiterate. There's a lot of information that would be helpful to know. It sounds like a great program but a little unbelievable. It would be great if it's something that we can do for the entire county.

MS. HORST: Absolutely. We will get you more information.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Are there any
questions or comments from the legislature
regarding that item? Is there any public comment on any of these items? Certainly Mr. Budnick.

MR. BUDNICK: I just want to raise an issue about these various health department supplemental appropriations. We have a severe problem, particularly in southeast Nassau County stretching from Legislator Walker and Schaefer's districts and it's down threatening Legislator Kennedy's District. It's called the Navy Grumman toxic waste plumes. And I do not see that the health department seems to be in the front lines trying to stop this problem before it destroys areas like the Massapequa Preserve, Tackapusha Preserve and our southern bay.

Thank you very much and thank you for putting up with me.

I have one other suggestion with regard to vaping and smoking. I think we might need a local law with regard to under 18 year olds that allows petitions to be filed in the family court as persons in need of supervision so that people under 18 found using vaping and tobacco don't have to be brought up as juvenile delinquents. Thank you very much for your time and trouble. God
