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LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: I would like to call the Rules Committee to order. We're going to have a brief Rules Committee meeting before we go into the full legislative meeting.

MR. PULITZER: Do you want the roll call?

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Before we do that $I$ would ask everyone to please stand and Legislator Kennedy to lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance. MR. PULITZER: Thank you. Rules Committee roll call. Legislator Siela Bynoe. Legislator Delia DeRiggi-Whitton.

MR. PULITZER: We have a quorum
sir.
LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: We have
several items. I'm going to call first five altogether so we can consider them as separate items but we can ask questions, if necessary take them out for a vote.

286, 287, 296, 297, 298. These are resolutions authorizing the county attorney to compromise and settle claims of the county of Nassau against the Incorporated Village of Cedarhurst and the Incorporated Village of Lawrence arising from agreements for the consolidation of sewage treatment resource services pursuant to the county law.

They are also resolutions
authorizing the county executive to execute

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amendments to intermunicipal agreements with the Incorporated Village of Lawrence and the Incorporated Village of Cedarhurst.

Lastly, there is a resolution authorizing the county executive to execute an amendment to a intermunicipal agreement with the Village of Sea Cliff in relation to the installation of sewer lines.

Moved by Legislator Rhoads.
Seconded by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. Do we have someone to speak on these items Katy? We will do the Cedarhurst and Lawrence matters first and then Sea Cliff is slightly different.

MS. HORST: Katy Horst from the administration. Connell Denion from the county attorney's office is joining remotely. He's just logging in now.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Do you want to wait to do your presentation Ken or wait for Connell?

MR. ARNOLD: I need Connell to talk about the settlements but $I$ can talk about the IMAs if you want me to start with
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those.
LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Okay. MR. ARNOLD: So, you have in front of you two IMAs. One with the Village of Cedarhurst amendment and one with the Village of Lawrence. Both of the IMAs come out of the settlement agreement that Connell Denion will bring up in a moment.

The Lawrence amendment is to have the county take over the collection of the sewer rates starting in 2021 and it also is a back payment of the monies owed. The Cedarhurst amendment is slightly different. Cedarhurst will continue to collect their sewer fees within their village and pay the county for the operation of the facility. LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Can tell us how much is going to be paid to the county?

MR. ARNOLD: I believe Connell
has that information. That's in the
settlement not in the agreements.
LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Is Connell on yet? We are waiting for Connell Denion to

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log on.
MR. ARNOLD: Also I can do that one while we're waiting.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Okay. I also did call Sea Cliff. MR. ARNOLD: The Sea Cliff amendment is tied to a project this body previously approved. This body previously approved a contract IMA with the village to sewer parts of Sea Cliff. When Sea Cliff took the bids on the project the bids came in better than anticipated. They requested that additional properties be added for the same amount of money originally allocated in the IMA. This amendment adds additional I think it was 44 or 47 additional properties that can be added to the sewer area that is being developed for the Village of Sea Cliff. There's no additional money. The cap in the original phase this just expands the scope.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Thank
you. Do you know off hand how much of the Village of Sea Cliff will be sewer as opposed to cesspools or whatever?

Rules - 10-26-20 MR. ARNOLD: I know it's a good part of their downtown area. I haven't done exactly the percentages. But this expands within their downtown area which is a tightly packed community. So it's very beneficial to get as much sewered as possible.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: It's obviously advantageous from an environmental standpoint?

MR. ARNOLD: Yes. Back 20 years ago when I worked on the Hempstead Harbor Protection Committee this was identified as something that should be looked. So it's nice to see 20 years later this coming to fruition.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: It's about average time for things to get done at the county.

MR. ARNOLD: It's been an ongoing project. Any type of sewer project is a big push because it's very expensive. Not a cheap project.

MS. HORST: Connell are you
there?
MS. KRETZING: Yes, I'm getting

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on.
MS. HORST: Are you ready to discuss the settlements with the legislature?

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Legislator
DeRiggi-Whitton.
LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Ken, before we move forward, $I$ just want to thank you for all your work with Sea Cliff, it's been amazing, and I'm glad we had these savings. I still think only like ten to 15 percent of Sea Cliff will be sewered after this but at least we're --

MR. ARNOLD: It's good. It's the
downtown area. It's the area that most
benefitted by the sewer also.
LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Some
of the restaurants in Sea Cliff had their septic systems in the basement. You can imagine what an improvement this is going to be. It's kind of gross.

Do you have any idea when we think that we will be able to start the hookups with the commercial?
MR. ARNOLD: I have to talk to

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the village to see they are with the project. I would think sometime in the spring we might be able to issue permits to people as they come in.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: As far as hooking it up to the sewer system for the Glen Cove sewage treatment plant is there anything else that we have to do like permit-wise or anything?

MR. ARNOLD: Each individual
homeowner will need to apply for a sewer permit. They got two years to do it because I think county health law once you have sewers valuable to you you have two years to connect.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: So
the actual sewer itself is connected to the Glen Cove sewage treatment plant now?

MR. ARNOLD: At the end of this project it will be, yes.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON:
Thank you.
LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Are they
ready? We have before us the items with respect to the villages of Cedarhurst and

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Lawrence. Just invite speakers from the county attorney's office to tell us about the settlements.

MS. KRETZING: Hi. It's Laurel Kretzing from the Bureau of Legal Appeals. I'm having a lot of feedback. Can you hear me? Are you on Connell?

MR. DENION: Yes.
MS. KRETZING: I just want to be clear that we're handling this settlement in full session and not in executive session?

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: That's accurate. Why don't you give us the details on the settlement.

MS. KRETZING: The facts of this matter were the county and the two villages entered into an agreement, an intermunicipal agreement back in 2008. It was amended in 2009. The agreement called for the county to undertake the work necessary to incorporate the two villages sewer systems into the county system and have the sewage processed in Bay Park. The county undertook the work.

The connection date was to be

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achieved by January 1, 2012 and it was not achieved until October of 2015 for both of the villages.

According to the agreement as amended in 2009, the villages took ECF financing and they were obligated to continue to collect their sewer rents and then pay over to the county the excess of the sewer rents over and above the principal and interest on the ECF financing. The villages failed to pay the monies over and they also failed to provide the documentation that they were required to provide under the agreement. After sending the requisite notice of default, the county -- we were required to -- we tried to work it out with the villages to no avail. We finally filed notices of claims with respect to the amounts that the county believed to be due, and after a series of negotiations we resolved the outstanding matters by compromising the claims and also by agreeing to the amendment. Which I couldn't tell whether Commissioner Arnold had spoken to that but Connell can speak to
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the amendment.
MR. DENION: Thank you Laurel. The amendments $I$ think Ken touched on them that the basic premise of the Lawrence amendment is that Lawrence will be incorporated into the sewer district as of January 2021. Whereas, Cedarhurst will not come into the district until either the county refunds the outstanding sewer debt or it matures. So that will be some point in the future. So Cedarhurst will not be folded into the district right away. And then we also clarified that the villages will each make payments annually for any amounts due until they become part of the district.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: How much is coming to the county for the settlements?

MS. KRETZING: Lawrence is paying approximately $\$ 5$ million and Cedarhurst is paying approximately two and a half million dollars.

LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Thank
you. Does anyone have any questions? Hearing none, any public comments? All in favor

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signify by saying aye. Those opposed?
Carries unanimously.
One other item on the Rules
Committee then we will go to the full
legislature. Other item is 308 of 2020. A resolution to transfer funds within the legislative budget control center LE15 on behalf of the majority delegation to the Nassau County Legislature.

I will move that. Seconded by Deputy Presiding Officer Kopel. Is there any debate or discussion on this item? Hearing none any public comments? All in favor signify by saying aye. Those opposed? Carries unanimously.

Motion to adjourn by Legislator Schaefer. Seconded by Legislator Rhoads. All in favor of adjourning signify by saying aye. Those opposed? Carries unanimously.

I neglected to do something before but Legislator Bynoe had arrived at the very beginning of the meeting, so I just wanted to confirm the record she was present and voted on all these items.
