LEGISLATOR LAFAZAN: Sorry. This
is Josh Lafazan. I am here.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you.
There are seven items on the original agenda that we will be calling first. I'm going to call the first three items, first four items together that deal with human services.

Clerk item 358-20 is an ordinance
supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Human Services.

Item E-359-20 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Human Services.

360-20 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Human Services.

And 361-20, an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Human Services.

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May I have a motion please. By
Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. Do we have anyone speaking on these items?

MS. HORST: Katy Horst from the administration. Brian Hall are you on?

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Brian we
really can't understand you.
MR. PERSICH: Andy Persich,
Office of Management and Budget. I will
substitute the best $I$ can for Mr. Hall.
The first item is a supplemental
appropriation for the Department of Mental Health in the amount of $\$ 3.9$ million. This is an annual recurring grant that we get. A supplemental that we get annually.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: This grant is for?

MR. PERSICH: For mental health services.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Are there any
questions from the legislators? Any public comment? 359-20.

MR. PERSICH: This is another

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supplemental appropriation in the amount of $\$ 13.5$ million. Again, for the Office of Mental Health for the year January 2021 through December 2021. It's for mental health services from the New York State Department of Mental Health.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions from the legislators? Any public comment? Item 360-20.

MR. PERSICH: This item is a supplemental appropriation for the Office of Chemical Dependency in the amount of $\$ 23.2$ million. It's for addiction support services and it's for the year starting January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions from the legislators? Any public comment? Clerk item 361-20.

MR. PERSICH: Clerk item 361-20 appropriates a supplemental appropriation of approximately $\$ 5.1$ million. It's for the methadone maintenance treatment. And the period starts January 1st through December 31st. These are all recurring grants that we

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get annually. We're doing them preemptive for 2021 so that's why I think Brian put them on the calendar so we can start spending the money in January.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: We're all set to go with it?

MR. PERSICH: Yes.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions by the legislators? Any public comment? Hearing none, and Andy thank you for stepping in.

MR. PERSICH: My pleasure.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: We will vote on items 358-20, 359-20, 360-20 and 361-20. All in favor signify by saying aye. Any opposed? Any abstain? They will move on to Finance.

Our next three items are with the Department of Health. Clerk item 364-20 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Health.

365-20 an ordinance supplemental to
the annual appropriation ordinance in

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connection with the Department of Health.
And 374-20 an ordinance
supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Health.

Motion please by Legislator
Schaefer. Second by Legislator Drucker.
MS. LAURAIN: Mary Ellen Laurain
from the Department of Health. Item 364-20 is
a supplemental appropriation. It's in the amount of $\$ 198,425$. This is for our childhood lead poisoning prevention grant. This is fully funded through the New York State Department of Health and its mission is to reduce the prevalence of blood lead levels in children.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions from the legislature on that item? Go ahead. MS. LAURAIN: Item 365-20 is a supplemental appropriation. It's in the amount of $\$ 5.6$ million. This is for the Ryan White program. This is 100 percent grant funded through the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The funds provide

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comprehensive health and human services to people living with HIV AIDS in Nassau and Suffolk County. Nassau County through an intergovernment agreement with Suffolk is the grantee and the United Way provides the administration of the grant.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Item 374-20.
MS. LAURAIN: Item 375-20 is a
supplemental appropriation. It's in the amount of $\$ 490,000$. It's for our sexually transmitted disease intervention services grant. This is fully funded through the New York State Department of Health and its mission is to confirm and treat sexual transmitted disease infections.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: That was item 374-20, correct?

MS. LAURAIN: Correct.
LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any questions for Ms. Laurain from the legislators? Any public comment? Hearing none, all those in favor of items 364,365 and $374-20$ signify by saying aye. Any nays? Any abstentions? They will move on to Finance.

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We have one other item on the agenda, and I need a motion to suspend the rules by Legislator Schaefer and seconded by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. All in favor of suspending the rules signify by saying aye.

This is clerk item 408-20. This is a resolution directing the Nassau County Department of Health to comply with the New York State Department of Health interim guidance on mandatory COVID-19 testing in public and nonpublic schools located in areas designated as yellow zones under the New York State Cluster Action Initiative as issued on October 9, 2020 and updated on November 12, 2020 .

Can I have a motion please? By Legislator Schaefer. Seconded by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton.

As you know, several areas in Nassau County have been designated as yellow zones already. In those yellow zones one way for the schools to remain open is to have 20 percent of the students and staff tested regarding COVID. We need to have -- the

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schools have the option of hiring someone on the outside -- I guess they have three options that are state mandated. This would be one of them.

Many, many of our school districts have reached out to legislators saying we need to be able to have this from Nassau County to follow the state guidelines and be able to move forward and to have our schools remain open.

What we are going to do today is move this forward and then we have some questions that need to be answered and in our full legislature we will bring this back. So, today it's basically moving forward with this and again have some of these questions addressed and they will come before the full leg next week.

All those in favor of moving this forward? Does anybody have any questions or comments from the legislators? Any public comment? All those in favor signify by saying aye. Any opposed? Any abstentions? No. So this will again move forward to the Rules

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Committee.
We do have to go back. There was one more item -- I apologize -- on the regular agenda. It was item 379-20 which was a resolution to authorize a transfer of appropriations made within the budget for the year 2020 .

May I have a motion please. By Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator Lafazan. Is there anyone that can speak on that?

MR. MCMANUS: Bob McManus from the budget office. Item 379-20 is a budget transfer in the amount of $\$ 200,000$ to enable the district -- excuse me -- from aa salaries to dd general expenses which will enable the district attorney's office to cover higher than anticipated witness protection expenses, information technology and miscellaneous supply expenses due to the COVID pandemic from our approved 2020 budget.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Does anyone have any questions? Any legislators with any questions? Any public comment? Hearing none,

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all those in favor of item 379-20 signify by saying aye. Any opposed? Any abstentions? This too will move on to Finance. And thank you and I apologize. I missed that before. MR. MCMANUS: No problem. Thank you.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you. There is no other business before this committee. May I have a motion to adjourn. By Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. All in favor signify by saying aye.
