Purpose: This is an agreement with the United States Geological Survey for the replacement of one monitoring well, screened in the Lloyd Aquifer located at Bay Park; geophysical logging, collection and analysis of water and sediments, and an aquifer performance test.

Method of Procurement: The USGS is the sole provider of the services.

Procurement History: N/A

Description of General Provisions: The work being done under this agreement include geophysical logging, collection and analysis of water and sediments, and an aquifer performance test, drill boreholes, geophysically log open boreholes; install 4" Schedule 80 PVC male-x-male casings and screens connected by 4" Schedule 120 PVC female couplings and end caps, all with National Pipe Thread; gravel pack, sand seal and grout annular space; develop wells; install locking box and cover or standpipe, obtain water levels, pump wells for water samples; test for VOC's, Inorganics, Chlorides, Pesticides, Emerging Contaminants such as PFO/PFOA, 1,4-Dioxane.

Agreement with United States Geological Survey (USGS)

The Department proposes to enter into an agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) for the replacement of one (1) Bay Park Monitoring Well screened in the Lloyd Aquifer, plus geophysical logging, collection and analysis of water and sediments, and an aquifer performance test. The USGS has a longstanding relationship with the Department associated with this type of work

This agreement will allow for assessment of the state of the Aquifer system, including the extent of saltwater intrusion beneath Nassau County's south shore providing critical water quality information to its water providers, as part of the USGS/NYSDEC Long Island Sustainability Study.

The specialized drilling services, expertise and technology employed provided by the USGS furnishes unique information on the County's three (3) Aguifers that is not available from any other entity; therefore, no RFP was issued. This information is invaluable for water resources planning and management of the County's groundwater which is the only source of drinking water for all County residents.

Terms of the agreement are for one (1) year beginning December 1, 2020 through November 30, 2021 at a total cost to the County of approximately \$428,700.00.

Appendix A

The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) and New York State Department of Environmental Conservation are conducting a cooperative study to evaluate the sustainability of Long Island's groundwater resource, now and for the future, by performing hydrogeologic mapping, monitoring of water quality and water levels, and developing a groundwater-flow model for this sole-source aquifer system. As part of this Long Island Groundwater Sustainability study, the USGS is installing outpost wells throughout Long Island to help better define the hydrogeology, and to map the current extent and model future movement of saltwater intrusion within the aquifer system.

Through this funding agreement, the USGS will install a replacement saltwater-interface outpost well at the Bay Park Sewage Treatment Plant located in East Rockaway, New York. The well will be drilled to bedrock and screened in the Lloyd aquifer, and replaces a long-term existing outpost well that was recently abandoned so that upgrades to the Bay Park Treatment facility could be completed.

This work shall be performed through the existing USGS Long Island Groundwater Sustainability study drilling contract. The well will be installed by a contracted private drilling company using the mud rotary method to drill an 8 to 9.5-inch diameter borehole for the purpose of installing a monitoring well in the borehole at this site. The borehole will be drilled to bedrock (estimated to be about 1,400 ft) and an additional 20 feet when possible. Sediment cores will be collected at varying interval during the drilling. The final depth of the well will depend on the depth at which bedrock is encountered during drilling.

The well will be installed using 4-inch polyvinyl chloride (PVC, Type I) schedule 80 or 120 well casing to the depth below ground surface as specified. Couplings will be made to be watertight to prevent leakage into or out of the well casing. The well will be finished at grade with a cement pad and locking surface cover.

The USGS will collect borehole geophysical logs at the well, perform an aquifer test, and collect and analyze water and sediment-core samples. Collected data will be integrated into the Long Island Groundwater Sustainability study dataset being used to determine the regional extent of saltwater intrusion on Long Island, and will provide updated hydrogeological data needed for the regional groundwater-flow model being developed for the study, which will ultimately provide water managers with a better understanding of aquifer sustainability across Long Island under various current and future stresses and scenarios.
