LEGISLATOR WALKER: Thank you very much. Including the addendum, there are two items on the agenda which are clerk items 93-21, which is on the regular agenda, and clerk item 147-21, which is on the addendum.

I'm going to ask first for a motion to suspend the rules by Legislator Schaefer. Seconded by Legislator Kennedy. All those in favor of suspending the rules please say aye. Any opposed? Rules are suspended.

So, let's start with clerk item 93-21, which is a local law to amend the county administrative code in relation to prohibiting the sale of electronic aerosol delivery systems or components or parts within 1,000 linear feet of a school, public park or playground.

May I have a motion please. By
Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator Drucker. So, this item is before us.

Just a little bit about this item. The Nassau County Legislature has work tirelessly to keep electronic aerosol delivery systems such as e-cigarettes and JOOLS out of the hands of minors under the age of 20 . Unanimously this body has approved legislation that prohibited their sales to individuals under the age of 21. Limited their advertising and display, the ban of sales of e-cigarettes and liquid nicotine products which are marketed towards minors.

This proposed local law prohibits businesses from selling electronic aerosol delivery systems or components or parts in any building that is less than 1,000 linear feet from a property improved with a school, public park or playground. If a business falls into this category it has until October 1, 2021 to cease and desist operating in this manner. The penalty for first violation range between $\$ 300$ and $\$ 1,000$ and between $\$ 500$ to $\$ 15,000$ for a second violation.

If enacted this legislation will further ensure that e-cigarettes, JOOLS and

other electronic aerosol delivery systems will stay out of the hands of Nassau County's young people.

Do any of the other legislators have anything to add? Legislator Kennedy.

LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: Thank you Legislator Walker. I'd just like to say as it has been said earlier, Dr. Reynolds had mentioned, the key is our children, we have to do everything we can in our power. And this is an additional step we're taking here today and I anticipate that we will have everybody on board with this. It's an additional step to make sure that our children are safe. Just one more thing that we can do.

As Legislator Walker said, we have done many things over the past couple of years and this will be one more thing and just to make sure that our children are safe and everybody is aware of what it is that is out there and make it a little bit better for our kids. Thank you.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Any other
legislators have anything to add? Legislator

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON:
Thank you Legislator Walker. I support this. I'm just thinking, do we know how many stores fall into this categories of being so close to schools? I'm just wondering what's going to happen if they have to close or move with the expense? Once again, I totally understand not having them near a school. Are we prohibited from restricting this type of business after it's already been in place for a while and the zoning allows for it?

LEGISLATOR WALKER: I don't know
how many it affects. A thousand feet, 1,000 linear feet, I'm trying to --

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I'm trying to do that too. It's probably -LEGISLATOR WALKER: I'm thinking of the length of a 25 yard pool which would be --

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: It's
like three football fields. Again, I definitely support it. But I'm just hoping that we're not going to be held responsible

financially if a business does belong to that category and has the proper permits and has the zoning for us to come in now and ban it. I'm not sure what the answer is. But I guess we're protected under this law now that we can put that type of regulation in?

LEGISLATOR WALKER: One of the things which we did say is they do have until October to comply. I would hope that if it involves some of these stores that they might think of something else maybe that they can do in their stores. I would hope -- I hate to see us destroy businesses in the process but hopefully it won't affect many.

I'm trying to think where in the communities $I$ represent where a lot of these vape shops and things are, most of them I can think of off the top of my head are not located close to a school or a park but I couldn't swear how many there are or how close that footage is.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I
think that in Glen Cove there might be one near the park and it's not directly in the

park but if you leave the parking lot I think it's within that.

So, again, whatever we can do to prevent kids from smoking anything is important. And believe me, I have kids and I support that. But I'm just thinking to myself. I don't know if the county attorney has any kind of opinion as to whether or not -- if a store is already established and has the zoning and the permits can we later come in and prohibit what they're selling?

LEGISLATOR SCHAEFER: We also
banned the sale of flavored vapes if you remember not too long ago.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I remember the flavored vapes. But they can exist without the flavored vapes. Like they can just adjust their inventory. Again, it's not the item itself. It's just whether or not we have the right to restrict something after a business has been in existence for so long. I know of one in Glen Cove that isn't going to be happy. Do we know if the county attorney weighed in on this at all?

MS. HORST: Katy Horst from the administration. I'm not sure but we can ask him to weigh in before the full leg.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: I was just going to say that. We haven't heard anything but we can certainly reach out. I know Legislator Drucker also -- were you finished Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton?

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON:
Yeah. Again, it's not that I don't support it. I just want to make sure that they're comfortable with the idea because right now it's vaping. I'm so torn because I want to protect the kids but I also don't like changing the rules for a business after they've been established especially in an area. I'd appreciate that opinion. Thank you Katy. And I'm fine with passing it through.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Legislator
Drucker.
LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Thank you Madam Chairwoman. I would just like to weigh in on what Legislator Schaefer said. We passed legislation prohibiting the sale of

fruit flavored vapes and that affected a lot of businesses. And I certainly, since I sponsored that legislation, received a lot of push back from local businesses.

But the governing municipality has the authority to pass laws that affect public health and this is public health. Of course, I defer to the county attorney but I can't imagine why we would be prohibited from passing legislation that really affects the health of our children and adults.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I
agree. I have had these conversation with the business owners of why you're going to allow a liquor store anywhere near these -- you know. I just want to make sure that we're doing it, we have the blessing from the county attorney.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: I have to
agree with you Legislator Drucker. I do believe we're all on the same page. I know we want to do what's best for our children and the health and safety of them.

Any other legislators have any

comments? Any public comment? Seeing none, hearing none on this, all in favor signify by saying aye. Any opposed? So, this will move on to the Rules Committee.

We did have one other, which is on our addendum, which is an ordinance. It's item 147-21. An ordinance supplemental to annual appropriation ordinance in connection the Department of Human Services.

A motion please. I thought we did it together but that's okay. We can do it again. Did we do it together? We'll just do it again. Legislator Schaefer and seconded by Legislator Drucker.

MR. HALL: Brian Hall, Human
Services. This is a supplemental appropriation grant 100 percent money from the Office of Family and Children and the department uses it for the youth programs for the three towns and two cities.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: Are there any
questions from the legislators for Mr. Hall?
Any public comment? Hearing none, all those in favor of clerk item $147-21$ signify by
