15	Clerk Item 223-21 is a local law
16	to amend the Nassau County
17	Administrative Code to create a special
18	revenue fund to assist Nassau County to
19	combat the opioid epidemic.
20	Can I have a motion?
21	LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: So moved.
22	LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON:
23	Second.
24	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Moved by

3	The item is before us.
4	This local law is to establish
5	this special revenue fund so that any
6	of the monies that we collect from the
7	opioid settlements will go into the
8	special revenue fund and will be used
9	to fight the opioid epidemic whether it
10	be used educationally, in prevention,
11	treatment, whatever ways it's best
12	used, but there will be a special
13	revenue fund setup and the monies will
14	only go towards fighting the opioid
15	epidemic.
16	Does anybody else want to add
17	anything to that?
18	LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I am
19	just happy that we're doing this so I
20	think it's a very good idea. I think
21	this whole opioid crisis has cost the
22	county so much, not just financially,
23	but emotionally, and I am glad these
24	companies are paying a little bit.
25	These companies made so much

2	money off this crisis so I think the
3	whole thing is positive, so thank you.
4	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: I agree and
5	it's sad because we were making head
6	ways, unfortunately due to COVID, we
7	really had a setback in fighting that
8	opioid epidemic.
9	I can tell you I know personally
10	a number of people that did overdose
11	and pass away during that time and many
12	others are fighting to keep moving
13	forward.
14	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Sure.
15	Absolutely. Thank you, Madam
16	Chairwoman.
17	You have got my support on this
18	one. This is another example where I
19	think we have to do more at our local
20	level, county level because the state
21	continues to fail us and, you know, we
22	understand that marijuana is a gateway
23	drug to opioid use, yet the state
24	representatives let us down by voting
25	in favor of passing the marijuana law.

2	So this is just the right thing
3	to do. The opioid epidemic is with us.
4	It's amongst us. It effects us in our
5	communities. It effects many in my
6	district, our youth, and we work well
7	with the Rockville Centre Coalition for
8	Youth and there have been numerous
9	overdoses over the last two years in
10	our district that this bill will
11	hopefully help to prevent in the
12	future.
13	So thank you for, one,
14	introducing it, and thank you for
15	allowing me to say a few words and you
16	have got my support.
17	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you,
18	Legislator Gaylor. Legislator Kennedy.
19	LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: Thank you,
20	Legislator Walker. I would just like
21	to say I am 100 percent behind this,
22	obviously my support is there.
23	I just wanted to say that we have
24	seen over the course of the last
25	approximate 15, 16 months, this

2	pandemic has caused tremendous stress
3	on so many people and I think that
4	maybe sometimes it hasn't been talked
5	about just how much people have been
6	impacted and in ways that we don't even
7	know yet. I think that it's so
8	important.
9	I have organizations in my
10	district, Massapequa Takes Action
11	Coalition, the Yes Communities Council
12	Center, Drug Free Long Island, so many
13	groups that are doing so many good
14	things, and I'm so happy that the
15	people can get the help that they need
16	and they continue on a path towards
17	success, and that they can really
18	benefit from this and we can really
19	help people. That's the bottom line.
20	That's it.
21	Thank you, Legislator Walker.

23	Legislator Kennedy. Legislator

3	fortunate that I am subbing in this
4	committee today and I am listening to
5	the statistics about the overdosing and
6	how it increased during COVID but it's
7	as timely as ever because we are about
8	to settle some major lawsuits with the
9	manufacturers of these opioid lawsuits
10	so it's good that we have a fund in
11	place and do whatever the county can do
12	as an entity to combat the opioid
13	epidemic, so thank you.
14	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you.
15	Legislator Mule.
16	LEGISLATOR MULE: Thank you,
17	Madam Chair.
18	I do fully support this and I was
19	glad to hear in your opening remarks
20	that it would not just be used for
21	treatment but it would also be used for
22	prevention because I think that's
23	incredibly important, but my question
24	is this, how will it be determined
25	which agencies will be getting the

2	money? What will be the criteria? Has
3	that been determined and who will make
4	those decisions?
5	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: I believe
6	that's something we really still need
7	to work out and make sure it's going to
8	the best places possible and for the
9	best education possible so we will be
10	continuing to work on that but it was
11	important to set up this designated
12	revenue source so these monies, once
13	these settlements are done, they go
14	right into it, not waiting for them to
15	happen and then all of a sudden we are
16	hurrying and rushing to put something
17	together.
18	LEGISLATOR MULE: I agree
19	completely. Will that be something
20	that's a possible amendment or
21	something the administration will be
22	deciding? How is that going to happen?
23	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Kind of what
24	I was saying before, we can certainly
25	from the executive offices, from the

3	departmental offices to see what the
4	best route is for us to move forward on
5	that but those have not been
6	established yet.

21	the annual appropriation ordinance in
22	connection with the Health Department.
23	MS. LAURAIN: Good evening.
24	MaryEllen Laurain, Department of
25	Health. Item 224-21 is a supplemental

3	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Sorry, we
4	didn't have a motion.
5	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: So moved.
6	LEGISLATOR MULE: Second.
7	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Moved by
8	Legislator Gaylor, seconded by
9	Legislator Mule.
10	MS. LAURAIN: Item 224-21 is a
11	supplemental appropriation and it's in
12	the amount of \$93,750. This is for a
13	sexually transmitted disease program.
14	It is funded through New York State
15	Department of Health and its mission is
16	to prevent the spread of sexually
17	transmitted diseases through
18	identification, treatment, and contact
19	investigations.
20	Item 225-21 is a supplemental
21	appropriation in the amount of
22	\$118,144. It's for the children with
23	the special healthcare needs program.
24	It's funded through New York State
25	Department of Health. It provides

2	information and referral to families of
3	children who are under the age of 21
4	who have a special need. Provides
5	information and referral.
6	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions
7	from the legislators?
8	(No verbal response.)
9	Any comments? Any public

12	Hearing none, all those in favor
13	of Clerk Items 224 and 225-21 signify
14	by saying aye.
15	(Aye.)

22	thank you for the update on the beach
23	closures.
