6	quorum, sir.
7	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Thank you,
8	Mr. Clerk. There is one item on the
9	agenda, Clerk Item 244-21. It's an
10	ordinance an ordinance to amend Section
11	2 of ordinance 73-2014 to extend to
12	members of the active military,
13	reserves and National Guard the
14	discounts to facilities and activities
15	of the Department of Parks, Recreation,
16	and Museums that are currently provided
17	to veterans.
18	May I have a motion?
19	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: So moved.
20	LEGISLATOR RHOADS: Second.
21	CHAIRWOMAN FERRETTI: Moved by
22	Legislator Gaylor, seconded by
23	Legislator Rhoads. The item is before
24	us. Who is here from the
0.5	

administration to speak about this

3	MS. CASO: Victoria Caso from the
4	Department of Parks. 244 is an
5	ordinance amending number 73-2014,
6	Section 2 as amended to provide our
7	active military reserves and National
8	Guard discounts in acknowledgment of
9	their service for various parks,
10	activities, and services by including
11	them within the definition of veterans.
12	All of these individuals entitled
13	to these discounts would present their
14	common access card to receive the
15	available discounts.
16	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Legislator
17	Gaylor.
18	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Thank you,
19	Chairman Ferretti.
20	Good evening. Could you just
21	tell me what does it mean active
22	military reserves and National Guard,
23	how is that defined.
24	MR. MCDERMOTT: Good afternoon.
25	Dennis McDermott, deputy county

2	attorney. The definitions for active
3	military are anyone who has use of the
4	common access card and the National
5	Guard and reserve, they are using the
6	state definitions.
7	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: So I just
8	wanted to get some clarification.
9	So this would include all active
10	military. Would it include retired
11	military such as myself who has a
12	retired military Department of Defense
13	card?
14	MR. MCDERMOTT: Yes, sir.
15	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Would it
16	include those active reserve and
17	National Guard members that have been
18	called to active duty status?
19	MR. MCDERMOTT: Yes, it would.
20	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: And would it
21	also include those that are not
22	currently on active status, they have a
23	CSE card?
24	MR. MCDERMOTT: I believe the
25	intention was that they would be

3	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: So it's
4	anybody who has a
5	MR. MCDERMOTT: CAC card.
6	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: CAC card or
7	some other form of retired
8	identification?
9	MR. MCDERMOTT: Correct.
10	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: What about
11	those veterans that have gone down to
12	the Nassau County Clerk's Office and
13	registered their DD Form 214, were
14	issued by the County Clerk a veteran's
15	card?
16	MR. MCDERMOTT: Well, the
17	veteran's are already covered under
18	this ordinance.
19	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Got it.
20	MR. MCDERMOTT: This is just
21	adding
22	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: The tweak on
23	the 2014 bill.
24	MR. MCDERMOTT: Correct.
25	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Got it.

3	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Legislator
4	Rhoads.
5	MR. RHOADS: Thank you, Chairman
6	Ferretti.
7	My understanding is and I got a
8	couple of emails on this is that the
9	Parks Department for active duty
10	military was actually already offering
11	free admission not discounted
12	admission, but free admission to active
13	duty military.
14	This bill that has been submitted
15	by the administration indicates
16	discounted.
17	So I want to make sure while I am
18	fully in favor of expanding the
19	definition, I don't want to be taking
20	away effectively a benefit to active
21	duty military.
22	MR. MCDERMOTT: Good evening,
23	legislator. Yes, the active military
24	and the families have been receiving
25	total waivers of these uncertain things

2	such as pools, but they haven't been
3	really receiving discounts on many
4	other things.
5	It was the intent of the
6	administration that those activities
7	where they already are having their fee
8	waived, that would continue, and it
9	would only be discounts for things that
10	they are currently not receiving any
11	break on.
12	LEGISLATOR RHOADS: But that's
13	not what the legislation says. So
14	perhaps between committees and full
15	session we should break out what's free
16	and what's discounted?
17	MR. MCDERMOTT: That can be done.
18	LEGISLATOR RHOADS: Thank you.
19	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Legislator
20	Gaylor.
21	LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: One more
22	question. Maybe between now and the
23	Full Leg we can we make it so anybody
24	serving active duty right now is exempt
25	from any fee for anywhere in any county

2	park. And then discount the rest.
3	That's what I would like to see.
4	MR. MCDERMOTT: We will bring it
5	back to the administration.
6	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Legislator
7	Birnbaum.
8	LEGISLATOR BIRNBAUM: Yes. So
9	now I am confused because I thought
10	this bill was to add these privileges
11	to the Military Reserves, the National
12	Guard, the same exact privileges that
13	it provided to veterans. So we have to
14	just make it equal.
15	So whatever veterans are getting,
16	they have to get as well. They all
17	have to be the same, right?
18	MR. MCDERMOTT: I do believe an
19	ordinance can make different
20	differentiation between active military
21	and veterans.
22	Legislator Gaylor wants
23	additional preferences, I guess, for
24	the active military as opposed to
25	veterans, but that's really I believe

2	the administration and the legislature
3	you know would have to come to some
4	meeting of the minds as to exactly what
5	discounts and how much would be
6	available.
7	MS. BIRNBAUM: Well, I am not
8	sure what the intent was because to me
9	it sounds like they should all be
10	equal.
11	MR. MCDERMOTT: Well, the intent
12	as drafted was to give the active
13	military the discounts that the
14	veterans are receiving now, and the
15	active military are not, but to
16	continue with the waivers for those
17	certain activities that the active
18	military is currently receiving.
19	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Let me ask
20	you. I think Legislator Birnbaum's
21	question may be best answered by maybe
22	Katie or, I mean, it sounds to me like
23	you are asking the intent of the bill,
24	right, I mean that's an administration
25	bill? Sorry Katie to put you on the

5	Legislator Birnbaum, you are correct.

9	veterans were already receiving.
10	As to Legislator Gaylor's point
11	that he brought up, I will absolutely
12	bring it back and get the
13	administration's opinion on it.
14	CHAIRMAN FERRETTI: Okay. Any
15	further debate or discussion?
16	(No verbal response.)
17	Do we have any public comment?
18	(No verbal response.)
19	There being none, all those in
20	favor of passing this item please
21	signify by saying aye.
22	(Aye.)
