All those in 16 favor of those items please so indicate by 17 saying aye. Any opposed? Those items pass 18 unanimously. I didn't have a motion on that. 19 So moved by Legislator Walker. Thank you. 20 And seconded by Legislator Drucker. Once 21 again, all those in favor please say aye. Any 22 opposed? 23 We have several items on the 24 consent calendar. Those would be numbers 355,

This is a hotel-motel tax 13 grant to support the Glen Cove Downtown Sound 14 concert series in the amount of \$10,000 to the 15 Glen Cove Downtown District Management 16 Association. 17 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Do we have any 18 questions or discussions? NEDELKO: A little over \$1.9 17 million. 18 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any 19 questions? Any discussion? All those in 20 favor please say aye. Any opposed? That item 21 is unanimous. 22 Number 365 is a supplemental 23 appropriation in connection with the Office of 24 Management and Budget. Motion by Ms. Walker. 25 Seconded by Mr. Lafazan.
