3	the Rules Committee to order and I'll call the
4	roll. Deputy Presiding Officer Kopel.
5	LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Here.
6	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Legislator
7	Rhoads.
8	LEGISLATOR RHOADS: Present.
9	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Legislator
10	Schaefer.
11	LEGISLATOR SCHAEFER: Here.
12	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Minority
13	Leader Abrahams.

23	you. We are all here.
24	Item three of 2022 is an ordinance
25	to be known as the Hiring Our Heroes Act

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 amending Section 6 of Ordinance 180-2016 to 3 exempt active duty and military veterans from 4 the payment of civil service examination 5 fees. б That's moved by Legislator Bynoe. 7 Seconded by Legislator Rhoads. Any debate or 8 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor 9 signify by saying aye. 10 Item four of 2022 is a resolution 11 that's authorizing and directing the treasurer 12 of Nassau County to assign certain tax lien 13 certificates in connection with property 14 located in School District 11, Town of 15 Hempstead. 16 That item is moved by Legislator 17 Schaefer. Seconded by Legislator Rhoads. 18 It's before us. It just went through Finance 19 a few moments ago. I'd asked that the minutes 20 be incorporated by reference into this 21 committee. Anyone have anything further to 22 add on this item? Legislator Bynoe. 23 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Thank you 24 Presiding Officer. I just want to make a note 25 that to say that it's to the full extent and

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 best interest of the county I think is, in 3 this moment, is premature to make that 4 statement. Aside from all the other questions 5 that are open on the floor and aside from the б fact that our inspector general has stated 7 that she has open issues, I think really can't 8 make a determination if it's in the best 9 interest of the county when we don't even know 10 how many units would be developed. The 11 granular details that would be necessary to 12 really make an informed decision are lacking. 13 So, I would argue that we'd have to 14 have to a lot more information as to how that 15 property would be developed, how many units, 16 how many affordable units, all of those things 17 before it would be the right move for the county's residents for us to even consider 18 19 something that appears to be against the ad 20 code.

There's a lot of things here in play and I don't think that in any time that we would either discount land in sale or any of that we would do that without having full understanding of what type of project would be

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 developed on that land. 3 So, in the interest of the county 4 residents, I will be voting no on this item. 5 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Т б think it's been common practice of this body 7 in the past whenever our inspector general had 8 any outstanding questions or concerns we 9 always respected that with tabling the item. 10 I think this has been our -- what we've done 11 in a bipartisan way and I would hope to see 12 that continue in the future. I think this is 13 the first time I can remember where the 14 inspector general had a question and we didn't 15 move to table it and we didn't table it. 16 So, look, I think at the end of the 17 day, having the inspector general not only 18 protects the county it protects us. And I 19 really hope that we continue with that pattern 20 of listening to her advice and acting 21 accordingly. 22 I would like to make another motion 23 to table when we're ready to do so and try to 24 do that at least on the Rules Committee to try

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to stop -- it's bad practice to go against

2	what the inspector general says.
3	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: I just
4	want to make a statement before you make the
5	motion. I would echo that I think there was a
6	point made in the Finance Committee that the
7	responses that we are seeking both legal and
8	the details about the development have to be
9	provided to the legislature before the full
10	legislature. We're not looking to have
11	someone come up and give us explanations on
12	the 24th. We want that information before the
13	24th.
14	Nick, I hope you take that back to
15	your to the county attorney. Again, so
16	that we're clear, we want the information
17	before the meeting. Anyway, go ahead,
18	Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton, make the motion.
19	LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: And
20	again, more than just this item, just
21	basically our common practice of abiding by
22	the recommendations of the inspector general I
23	now would like to make a motion to table this
24	item.
25	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Second?

3	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Seconded
4	by Legislator Bynoe. All in favor of the
5	motion to table signify by saying aye. Those
б	opposed? The motion to table fails by a vote
7	of four to three. Does anyone else have any
8	other comment? Legislator Rhoads.
9	LEGISLATOR RHOADS: My
10	recollection is that our common practice is
11	actually to tee up items for the full
12	legislature while we're waiting on additional
13	information. I don't see this as being
14	substantially different from that. I think
15	that the committees, both Finance now and
16	Rules have expressed their concerns about the
17	lack of information that's been provided and
18	have set forth very clear instructions that
19	that information must be provided before it's
20	considered before the full legislature with
21	the understanding that if it's not obviously
22	it will be tabled at that time.
23	So, I don't have a problem voting
24	for the item now with the understanding that
25	we'll get the information before the full

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 legislature. If we don't receive it we will 3 take appropriate action at that time. 4 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Anyone 5 else. 6 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: I don't want 7 to get into a debate, but I can't recollect a 8 time where we did not honor the advisement of 9 our inspector general. She's our chief 10 advisor in the role of making this body aware 11 of any possible misconduct or anything that 12 would be against the charter of this county 13 government. She's who we rely on and we have 14 never once bucked her authority or her role as 15 our chief advisor to tell us that there's 16 concerns about an issue and that she wouldn't 17 even advise that it goes through committee. 18 This is the first time. 19 I'm kind of saddened that we're

taking this approach because I really felt that we worked in a very bipartisan way when it came to the county inspector general giving us advice as 19 legislators and responsible as the fiduciaries of this county.

25 So, for us to take a stance today

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 that to we will just buck here advice I think 3 we're setting a bad precedent and I think this 4 is not the way to start off our first meeting 5 of this term. 6 I really implore my colleagues on 7 this committee to not keep this up because 8 we've never teed these types of items up. 9 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Legislator 10 Rhoads. 11 LEGISLATOR RHOADS: Thank you 12 Mr. Chairman. I don't see us as bucking any 13 authority of the inspector general. The 14 inspector general indicated that she did not 15 have sufficient information. We've set forth 16 a pathway to obtain that information before we 17 consider it as part of the full legislature. 18 And I would anticipate that if we do not 19 receive that information as indicated we'll 20 take appropriate action at that time. 21 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: I definitely 22 want to change the language and I think I 23 Not her authority but her advisement. did. 24 Here consultation to this body. 25 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: All

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 right. Any other debate or discussion? Any 3 public comments? All in favor signify by 4 saying aye. Those opposed? It's a vote of 5 four to three that this item moves on -- it's б a vote of four to three we will be moving this 7 on, potentially, go before the full 8 legislature. 9 Six of 2022 is a resolution to 10 amend Resolution 112 of 2022 establishing the 11 special legislative task force to combat 12 anti-Semitism. 13 Moved by Legislator Kopel and 14 seconded by Minority Leader Abrahams. Before 15 we do that, I need a motion to suspend the 16 rules of the Rules Committee. Moved by Deputy 17 Presiding Officer Kopel. Seconded by Legislator Schaefer all in favor of suspending 18 19 the rules signify by saying aye. Those 20 opposed? Carries unanimously. 21 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: At this time 22 I'll talk about clerk item 6-22 which is a 23 resolution to establish a special legislative 24 task force to combat anti-Semitism. This was 25 originally introduced last year and passed

Ιt 3 was introduced by, if I recall, Legislators 4 Lafazan and Drucker, for which I thank them. 5 Somehow the task force never did formally get б organized, so we would like to get that done. 7 This resolution simply provides 8 dates upon which the task force A, will be 9 constituted. Which would be International 10 Holocaust Remembrance Day, January 27th of 11 this year. And will require the task force as 12 constituted providing recommendations to the 13 presiding officer and minority leader by Yom 14 HaShoah, which is on April 28th. And I simply 15 urge everybody to vote for this and we'll get 16 it done. 17 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Any other discussion? Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton. 18 19 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Т 20 was just asked to make some type of 21 clarification that Minority Leader Kevan 22 Abrahams was one of the --23 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: One of the 24 original sponsors? 25 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: On

1 Rules - 1-10-22 2 the task force, yes. He's a member you 3 inadvertently omitted. 4 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: He was I'm 5 sorry? б LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Т 7 don't see his name on it. If we could add his 8 name. 9 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Was he a 10 sponsor? 11 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: He 12 was on the task force along with Drucker and 13 Lafazan. 14 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: I think 15 she was noting for the record that they were 16 appointed to the task force. You can do 17 that. There's no relevance to this, to 18 actually changing the date which obviously has 19 to be done. 20 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Т 21 agree. I guess because we mentioned the other 22 two I just wanted to make sure that minority 23 leader --24 LEGISLATOR KOPEL: I mentioned 25 them as the original sponsors. That's all I

2	did. I didn't discuss who the members were at
3	all.
4	LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Any other
5	debate or discussion. Any public comment?
б	All in favor signify by saying aye. Those
7	opposed? That carries unanimously.

9	Legislator Rhoads. Seconded by Legislator
10	Schaefer. All in favor of adjourning signify
11	by saying aye. Those opposed? We're
12	adjourned.
