Howard Kopel. We have a quorum sir.

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LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Thank you.
Since we have a numbers of items on the addendum that we are going to deal with early, I'm going to ask for a motion to suspend the rules. And so moved by Legislator Walker and seconded by Legislator Drucker. All in favor of suspending the rules please say aye. The rules are suspended. Thank you.

Now, I'm going to call a number of items all of which are similar. These are either to wholly or partially exempt certain real properties, various properties around the county and those would be numbers 256,257 , 258, 259, 260, 261, 262, 263, 264, 265, 267, 268. And on the addendum 295. All those in favor of those items please signify by saying aye. Motion by Mr. Ferretti. Seconded by Ms. Walker. All those in favor of those items please say aye. Any opposed? Those items are passed unanimously.

Next we are going to deal with a number of items that have gone through other committees and require no further debate or discussion. Those items would be number 266,

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270, 272, 273, 274, 275, 279, 280, 282, 283. That's it.

Motion for those items by Mr.
Drucker and seconded by Mr. Ferretti. All
those favor of those items please so signify by saying aye. Any opposed? Those items are once again unanimous.

Now for the remaining items and we'll start with, let's see here, number 271, which is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation in connection with the Department of Toxicology, the medical examiner.

There's a motion by Mr. Rhoads and seconded by Mr. Lafazan.

MS. KELLY: Carolyn Kelly, deputy medical examiner on behalf of this number 271-22. It's an annual supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Department of Toxicology. This covers three grants. The first is the New York State Aid to Crime Lab grant from DCJS in the amount of $\$ 102,108$. It's used to support the accreditation costs and activities of the

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toxicology lab under the umbrella of the medical examiner's office.

The second grant is a New York State DMV Highway Traffic Safety grant in the amount of $\$ 36,000$. It's a federal pass-through grant. This one supports drunk driving and drugged driving impaired driver testing of blood and urine.

The third grant is a New York State Department of Health enhanced toxicology testing grant in the amount of $\$ 63,452$. Again, this is also a federal pass-through grant. This grant supports drug testing related to the opioid and drug overdoses. LEGISLATOR KOPEL: So they're all pass-throughs. Are there any questions? Hearing none, all those in favor of this item, item 271 , please so signify by saying aye. Any opposed? That item is unanimous.

Number 276, which is transfer of
appropriations, and there's a motion by Mr. Solages. Seconded by Ms. Walker. MR. ARNOLD: Ken Arnold. Good afternoon. 276 is a board transfer to

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reallocate traffic safety funds from the interfund account in the department's budget to the general expense account.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? All those in favor please say aye. Any opposed? That item is unanimous once again.

Number 277 is another transfer of appropriations and there's a motion on that one by Mr. Drucker. Seconded by Ms. Walker.

MR. DELANEY: Thomas Delaney, Office of Emergency Management. Item 277-22 is a board transfer within a single appropriation allowing us to spend down the grant funds that we were awarded.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? All those in favor please say aye. Any opposed? That item is unanimous. 278 is a supplemental to the annual appropriations in connection with the county clerk and there's a motion on that by Mr. Rhoads. Seconded by Mr. Ferretti.

MR. BUTLER: John Butler, fiscal
officer for Nassau County Clerk Maureen

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O'Connell's office.
Item 278-22 is for a New York State
local government records management
improvement fund grant in the amount of
$\$ 5,435$. Our office will use this grant to further the digitalization of records in our office. Specifically $\$ 50,000$ oath of office carts.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Thank you.
Any questions? All those in favor please say aye. Any opposed? 278 is unanimous. Thank you.

Number 284 is a supplemental with the office of management and budget. Motion by Mr. Rhoads. Seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MR. PERSICH: Good afternoon. Andy Persich, Office of Management and Budget. This item is appropriating $\$ 3$ million of the worker's comp money received in 2018. We have a list of claims that we will be coming to you with.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: You said from
the state?
MR. PERSICH: This is the money

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from the state that we got. We have a list of the claims that didn't line us simultaneously with the settlement of the claims but we wanted to appropriate the money now because we have a 30-day window once we make those settlements that we have to get the money out the door. This is settling some old claims that we had out there and this is the monies from the state that we are using.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Do you have anything else or is that it?

MR. PERSICH: I have one other
item which is yours which is the board transfer 301.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Why don't I go ahead and call 301 as well. 301 is a board transfer for the year 2022. That is a motion by Ms. Walker and seconded by Mr. Lafazan. MR. PERSICH: This is a board transfer between the clerk of the legislature between line items for monies that they require.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? All those in favor of those two

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items please say aye. Any opposed? Those are unanimous as well. Thank you Andy.

285 is another transfer of
appropriations. Another motion by Ms. Walker and seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MR. DELANEY: Item 285-22 is a board transfer within a single appropriation. Again, allowing us to spend down our grant funds.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? All those in favor of 285 please say aye. Any opposed? That is unanimous. Thank you.

On the addendum now. First
addendum. 288 is a resolution authorizing the county to implement a program of projects funded by state master transportation capital program. Motion on that by Mr. Ferretti and seconded by Mr. Rhoads.

MR. ARNOLD: Good afternoon. Ken
Arnold. 288 is a master agreement with the New York State DOT. This is the ten percent match that we get for our bus funding. The federal government provides 11.5. This is the

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state's way of getting us the 1.5 million. And this is used for our rolling stock, capital improvements, capitalized maintenance.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Thank you. Any questions? All those in favor please say aye. Any opposed?

Number 296 is making certain determinations pursuant to SEQRA relative to a franchise agreement between the county of Nassau and Signal Outdoor Advertising as a franchisee authorizing the franchisee to maintain and install bus shelters and bus benches at various bus stops.

And that motion is made by Mr. Ferretti. Seconded by Mr. Solages.

MR. HOMMEL: Ted Hommel from the county attorney's office appearing for the Department of Public Works.

This is to approve an amendment to a franchise agreement that expired on March 31 of 2020 right at the inception of the COVID pandemic.

The initial franchise agreement was for a term of ten years. It had two five-year

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renewal options. This amendment, subject to the legislature's approval, would formally exercise the first renewal the option. The franchisee installs and maintains the bus shelters and benches throughout the county and has the exclusive advertising rights on those facilities. They pay a percentage of the gross advertising. They pay a percentage of the gross advertising receipts billed versus the minimum guarantee of $\$ 600,000$ per year. Those are the essentials. If there are any questions $I$ will be happy to try to answer them.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? Hearing none, all those in favor of that item please say aye. Any opposed? Thank you.

Number 270 is a supplemental with Parks, Recreation and Museums. Never mind.

Now I'm going to call a number of items which will require executive session. I'm going to call them all together. Those would be numbers 228 on the regular calendar. And on the addendum we will have numbers 289,

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290, 291, 292, 293, 302. And motion on those items is made by Mr. Drucker and seconded by Mr. Ferretti.

And now I'm going to have a motion to go into executive session on all those items made by Mr. Rhoads and seconded by Mr. Lafazan. All those in favor of going into executive session please say aye. Any
opposed? We are going into executive session on those items to which members of the Rules Committee are invited as well.
