LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Present. MR. PULITZER: We have a quorum sir.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: There are four items on the agenda today which are clerk items number 266-22, 275-22, 280-22 and 283-22.

Clerk item 266-22 is a resolution approving a federal aid project administered by the New York State Department of Transportation and authorizing the county of Nassau to participate in the nonfederal share of the cost of construction, and in the cost of construction supervision and inspection of the project, and authorizing the county executive of the county of Nassau to execute an agreement on behalf of the county with the New York State Department of Transportation for the performance of such work for the project and for participation by the county in the nonfederal share of the cost of the project, which is identified as PIN 0761.59 for the Management Enhancement application. May I have a motion. Moved by

Legislator Giuffre. Seconded by Legislator Solages. That is before us. I see we have Commissioner Arnold at the podium to speak about this item.

MR. ARNOLD: Good afternoon. Ken
Arnold. 266-22 is a New York State master agreement that provides 80 percent funding, or \$1 million, for the traffic management
enhancement application. This application is
a web-based database that we use to track signal issues, maintenance and inventory.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Just out of
curiosity, the 20 percent that's remaining is funded by the state? MR. ARNOLD: No. 20 percent is funded by capital.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Is there any debate or discussion? Any public comment? All in favor please signify by saying aye. Any opposed? The item passes unanimously. Clerk item 275-22 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with public works. May I have a motion. Moved by

Legislator Walker. Seconded by Legislator Drucker. The item is before us. Commissioner Arnold it's all yours.

MR. ARNOLD: 275-22 is a
supplemental appropriation from the federal transit administration for our annual grant for 2023 associated with the NICE bus. The grant is for is for \(\$ 11.5\) million and that will be used for rolling capital needs and capitalized maintenance.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: That's all
for the bus, NICE bus system, correct?
MR. ARNOLD: That is correct.
It's 80 percent of the total funding that we utilize for that program. Ten percent from the state, which is an item later on, and the remaining ten percent is county capital.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Any debate or
discussion? Any public comment? All in favor please signify by saying aye. Any opposed?

The item passes unanimously.
Clerk item 280-22 is a resolution
authorizing the county of Nassau to
participate in a transportation project

providing for the restriping of various county roads under capital project number H62I53-I4G and that's PIN 0761.67 and authorizing the county executive of the county of Nassau to execute the agreement on behalf of the county with the New York State Department of Transportation for the advancement of said aid for transportation projects in Nassau County. May I have a motion. Moved by Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator Bynoe. The item is before us.

MR. ARNOLD: So item 280-22 is another New York State master agreement. This is for pavement markings what we call phase 14. It's providing the federal share of \(\$ 1\) million. This is our normal pavement marking funds we receive from the TIP, which is the New York State Transportation Improvement Plan.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: So the question for you Commissioner Arnold. The reimbursable amount is \(\$ 1\) million or 3.2? I saw something in the backup about 3.2 million.

MR. ARNOLD: Let me double
check.
LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: The staff summary says one million but I believe the backup may show a little bit --

MR. ARNOLD: Let me double-check the backup then. I only checked the staff summary. You are correct. We are getting \(\$ 3.2\) million. The whole project is worth \(\$ 4\) million.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: You'll
provide us with an updated, some updated information on it?

MR. ARNOLD: The contract itself
is the lead document.
LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Very good.
Any debate or discussion? Any public comment? Ms. Mereday.

MS. MEREDAY: Yes. Good
afternoon. Meta J. Mereday. With regard to this contract and I guess the previous two my concern and my ongoing request in terms of ensuring that there is diversity inclusion with these projects that are getting state and

more than likely federal funding that we are making sure that we are making every effort, not just the basic or baseline, every effort to be inclusive of service disabled veterans, minority women, etcetera in these projects. And that the projects themselves represent a cross section of the county. Particularly when we're talking about transportation. When we have so many residents who depend on transportation. I don't know the previous resolution as it pertains to buses. I don't know if it's maintaining the current level of buses. But I don't know if there's consideration for additional buses and reinstating some bus lines for many of our seniors as well as veterans who continue to have issues with transportation.

So, the diversity, the inclusion and making sure that the transportation funds are equitable throughout the county is my request. Thank you. LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: All very good points. Appreciate that Ms. Mereday. Commissioner Arnold you want to address?

MR. ARNOLD: In relation to the master agreements, New York State requires DB eagles for all their project funding and the department works with them to meet those goals.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: And I think, Ms. Mereday, on your comment about the buses, the funding of that 11 and a half million dollars was not to increase the number of lines but to replace the capital items, the fleet, the vehicles themselves, as well as the facility, the upgrades. Am I correct on that?

MR. ARNOLD: That's correct.
LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Any other public comment? Legislator Walker.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: In regard to the fleet themselves, do we have any other information about the buses that were on fire and destroyed? Are they buses that were obsolete already?

MR. ARNOLD: Those buses had completed their useful life. In excess of 20 years. They were there to be salvaged and

sold. And I don't know the extent of the investigation.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: But they were already buses that we had taken completely out of service?

MR. ARNOLD: They were out of service buses.

LEGISLATOR WALKER: That's what I thought but \(I\) just wanted to verify that. Thank you.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Back to
280-22. Excuse me, Legislator Giuffre. Go ahead.

We're going to take a vote on 282-22. All in favor please signify by saying aye. Any opposed? The item passes unanimously.

Go ahead. Legislator Giuffre he'd just like to make a comment.

LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Ken, I
wanted to thank you. I know there was a paving project in my district. One of my constituents. Inevitably there's going to be some curb damage sometimes and you responded

immediately. The constituent was pleased. I know it's being taken care of. Thank you for that.

MR. ARNOLD: Thank you for recognizing that.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Next item before us is clerk item 283-22 which is an ordinance supplemental to the annual
appropriation ordinance in connection with public works.

May I have a motion. Moved by Legislator Giuffre. Seconded by Legislator Drucker. The item is before us. MR. ARNOLD: 283-22 is a supplemental appropriation for the department to receive an additional \(\$ 100,000\) from New York State DEC through the Long Island Regional Planning Council. This money is part of our septic rebate program and that's what it will be utilized for.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Can you just give me a quick status of the septic rebate program? How many residents have applied? MR. ARNOLD: I don't have that

handy. I knew you were going to ask that question today. So if \(I\) can bring that to the leg session and get you an update. Because this program is also tied to other funding sources including ARP. So there's a lot of pieces and parts. So I'll get you a status of the whole program.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Status. How
many residents. How much has been awarded.
MR. ARNOLD: We'll get something
to this body before that meeting.
LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Thank you
Commissioner Arnold. Is there any other debate or discussion?

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Mr. Chairman thank you. Ken, just a quick question because on some of the other projects that we're seeing obviously are multimillions of dollars. This one is \(\$ 100,000\) for replacing aging and failing septic systems. It just seems like a low amount, \(\$ 100,000\).

MR. ARNOLD: What happens a lot of times in these grants is there's money that gets passed through different programs. We've

received, and this body \(I\) think has approved from the DCE I think it's \$2 million for the same program. They jumble together different fundings and we receive it and it's just how we accept it.

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: This just adds to what we've already receive?

MR. ARNOLD: Yes. And when I get you the update you'll see the bigger picture. Because there's also ARP that matches. So this is a fairly decent size program.

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Thank you
Ken. Appreciate that.
LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Any other debate or discussion? Any public comment? All in favor please signify by saying aye. Any opposed? The item passes unanimously.

So, we have an addenda item to our agenda. I need a motion to suspend the rules. Moved by Legislator Walker. Seconded by Legislator Bynoe. All in favor please signify by saying aye. The rules are now suspended.

So, there's one item on the agenda

today which is clerk item 288-22. It's a resolution authorizing the county to implement a program of projects funded by the state mass transportation capital program to advance such funds required to be advanced by the county and the state of New York to implement such program and to authorize the county executive to execute any and all agreements and other documentation necessary to implement this program.

Commissioner Arnold.
MR. ARNOLD: Yes. So, like I mentioned earlier, 288 is another master agreement with New York State for \(\$ 1.5\) million. This is the ten percent match for the 11.5 that the federal government provides. So, that's how this program is put together each year. Federal aid 80, state ten, county capital is the last ten percent. This master agreement is that contract with the state to receive that \(\$ 1.5\) million.

LEGISLATOR GAYLOR: Rules are
suspended. I don't think we need a motion. We can make a motion. I don't think so but we

can make a motion if you think you need it. But once we suspend the rules my understanding is we don't need the motion. We'll say it's moved by Legislator Kennedy. Seconded by Legislator Solages.

Again, the item is now before us. Do we have any public comment? All in favor of the item signify by saying aye. Any opposed? The item passes.

There's no other business in front of this committee. Can \(I\) have a motion to adjourn? Moved by Legislator Walker. Seconded by Legislator Giuffre. All those in favor say aye. This committee is now adjourned.
