9	MR. NOLAN: Good afternoon, Chris
10	Nolan, Office of Management and Budget.
11	As Andy mentioned, this item is
12	transferring some of the remaining
13	dollars that are left in the HAP Program;
14	\$20,140,000 to be exact. It's going to a
15	number of different programs, I believe
16	it's eight programs. Five of which have
17	already been established and three of
18	which are new.
19	Just to give you a highlight of the
20	funding that's being moved:
21	- \$10 million is being moved into
22	the Main Street Grant Program. There's
23	an existing \$20 million in there now, so
24	it will bring it up to 30;
25	- We're moving \$2 million into the

2	Septic System Replacement Fund Program;
3	- \$2 million to the Behavioral Help
4	Support;
5	- \$1.5 to VEEB,
6	- \$1.4 to Tourism;.
7	Then there are three new programs:
8	- \$1 million Broadband;.
9	- \$1 million Nonpublic schools
10	assistance; and
11	- \$1.24 million for two offices
12	within Health and Human Services
13	vertical.

2	MR. GROSS: I'm outside Labor			
3	Counsel to Nassau Community College. I'm			
4	here today to support and urge your			
5	approval for the County Legislature to			
6	ratify a settlement with the Adjunct			
7	Faculty Association. You may be aware			
8	that the Adjunct Faculty Association			
9	numbers about 3500 professors; any where			
10	from 1000-1500 teach semester.			
11	The College, and everybody, went			
12	through a very difficult time with Covid			
13	and the Adjunct Faculty Association			
14	certainly worked very hard to pivot from			
15	a live presentation of course materials			
16	to a remote modality.			
17	The negotiations this year focused			
18	essentially on money. I'm sure you're			
19	aware of what's going on in the country			
20	in terms of inflationary pressures. The			
21	College decided to focus on a one year			
22	contract. The Adjunct Faculty			
23	Association does not receive step			
24	increments like a lot of the contracts			
25	I'm sure you see in the County. The

1	FINANCE COMMITTEE 10.03.2022
2	agreement reached was 1.9 across the
3	board. Because of all the efforts they
4	made during the Covid crisis, the College
5	agree to \$150-160, depending upon the
6	ranking of the particular professor, one
7	time cash payment, not to base salary, in
8	recognition for all the efforts they made
9	during the Covid crisis. The only other
10	aspect of the agreement is an agreement
11	to SUNY, which of course has very large
12	regulatory footprint on the college, has
13	permitted a continued utilization of
14	remote instruction and we have agreed
15	that will continue for a year and the
16	professor in contrast to full time
17	faculty can do that from home, doesn't
18	have to be present. That is also in
19	recognition of the student body that has
20	become very used to this type of course
21	presentation. That sunsets in one year.
22	We anticipate that SUNY may change it's
23	position. The cost of this is fully
24	subsumed within the College Budget.
25	There's no impact on the County Budget.
