CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: I'd like to call the Health and Social Services Committee together and I'll ask the Clerk to please take the roll.

CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, Madam Chairwoman. Health and Social Service roll call.

4 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Here.

5 CLERK PULITZER: We have a quorum,
6 Ma'am.

7 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you.

8 There's two items before us. Clerk
9 items 351 and 352 are both ordinances
10 supplemental to the annual appropriation
11 ordinance in connection with the Health
12 Department. May have a motion, please?
13 Legislator Gaylor, seconded by Legislator
14 Lafazan. All set.

15 MS. DESIMONE: Good afternoon, Ann
16 Desimone, Nassau County Department of
17 Health. Item 351-22 is actually two
18 items. One is the supplemental
19 appropriation in the amount of \$118,144
20 for the children and youth with special
21 healthcare needs. This is funded by New
22 York State Department of Health. This
23 program provides information and referral
24 to families of children up to age 21 who
25 have special healthcare needs. Any

3 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions on
4 that part of Clerk Item 351?

5 (Whereupon, no verbal
6 response.)

7 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: And part two?

8 MS. DESIMONE: Part two is a
9 supplemental appropriation in the amount
10 of \$966,202 for the Early Intervention
11 Administration Grant received from the
12 New York State Department of Health.

13 Early intervention is a mandated
14 program that identifies toddlers and
15 infants 0 to 3 who are at risk for
16 delayed development. EI provide services
17 to ensure that eligible infants and
18 toddlers with developmental delays and
19 disabilities receive appropriate
20 services.

21 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Okay. And this
22 is an area where we said we've seen an
23 increase in, especially since COVID.

24 MS. DESIMONE: Correct.

25 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any other

1
2 questions from the legislators?

3 Legislative Drucker.

4 LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Thank you,
5 Madam Chair.

6 Does it define what developmental
7 disabilities it includes?

8 MS. DESIMONE: It's a wide range.
9 They may not be hitting milestones.
10 Sometimes they have medical diagnosis.

11 LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Would hearing
12 deficiency?

13 MS. DESIMONE: Certainly. Certainly.

14 LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Thank you.

15 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: And these are
16 usually detected by a child's
17 pediatrician or even a parent who feel
18 that sometimes it's their second child or
19 whatever, or they have no other children
20 of that age and they feel like their
21 child is way behind.

22 MS. DESIMONE: Yes.

23 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: So then they
24 just reach out to a pediatrician who then
25 refers them to the County.

2 MS. DESIMONE: Correct or parents
3 can call as well.

4 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Okay. Any other
5 questions from the legislators?

6 (Whereupon, no verbal
7 response.)

8 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any public
9 comment?

10 MS. MEREDAY: Good afternoon. Meta
11 J. Mereday. With regard to the two
12 grants, I didn't get the amount of the
13 first one. I'm just concerned if there is
14 -- if we're looking at the funding that
15 we're providing to children and youth and
16 not shortchanging, again, because the
17 increased needs within our vulnerable
18 population. And are we identifying any
19 additional resources if the County is
20 more involved with providing funding and
21 resources in other areas until crisis
22 hits and then all of a sudden you have
23 people saying, oh, we needed to have more
24 money. I'm thinking if we if we put more
25 money into the system more proactively

2 versus reactively, we might get better
3 outcomes.

4 Also, the \$966,000, I believe she
5 said, with regard to early intervention,
6 does that tie into anything that has to
7 deal with the maternal mortality rate for
8 black women, which is 3 to 4 times
9 higher? So if black women are dying in
10 childbirth, you know, there's a number of
11 children that are now motherless, and we
12 don't know what that impact is on that
13 child early on and if the Health
14 Department is actively and aggressively
15 addressing that situation, because it is
16 impacting mothers of color here in Nassau
17 County.

18 So I'm just concerned if there was
19 an increase, as well as the resources
20 that are going towards the special youth
21 component in the first scenario as well
22 as the early intervention. How broad is
23 this early intervention support system
24 and is it inclusive in addressing issues
25 that are impacting, again, underserved

2 communities in Nassau County? Thank you.

3 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Ann, do you have
4 any information on?

5 MS. DESIMONE: So I know this is a
6 topic that's well covered, but I will get
7 the exact data from the Director of
8 Maternal Child Health on your question.

9 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Okay. And if you
10 could share that with all of us on the
11 Committee. Thank you.

12 Clerk Item 352-22.

13 MS. DESIMONE: Sure. That is a
14 supplemental appropriation for the
15 Bathing Beach Water Quality Monitoring
16 and Notification Program for the amount
17 of \$58,350. This is New York State
18 Department of Health funding and is
19 mandated through the New York State
20 Sanitary Code. This program provides
21 beach water quality monitoring at 56
22 permitted beaches in the county. Public
23 notification is required when there is a
24 closure or an opening. Any questions?

25 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: You know, really

1
2 just to comment on my behalf. I thank
3 you for this past summer, it was often
4 that we got information regarding beach
5 closure closures. And let's hope that
6 next summer is a better summer and don't
7 have to close the beaches as much.

8 MS. DESIMONE: I will pass that
9 along to the program director. Thank you.

10 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you. Any
11 other questions or concerns?

12 (Whereupon, no verbal
13 response.)

14 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any public
15 comment?

16 (Whereupon, no verbal
17 response.)

18 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Hearing none.
19 All in favor of Clerk Items 351-22 and
20 352-22 signify by saying aye.

21 (Whereupon, all members of
22 the Health and Social Services
23 Committee respond in favor.)

24 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any opposed, any
25 abstentions?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Then they will
both move on to Finance. No other
