There are three items on the agenda today which are Clerk Item numbers 159-23; 162-23; 163-23.

Clerk Item number 159-23 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the Nassau County Office of Crime Victim Advocate. May I have a motion?

Moved by Legislator McKevitt, seconded by Legislator Pilip.

The item is before us. Who is here from the Administration to discuss this?

MS. DIEHL: Good evening, honorable members. I'm Jeanine Diehl, Executive Director of the Nassau County Office of Crime Victim Advocate.

On August 1st of 2022, the Nassau County Office of Crime Victim Advocate procured the Victim of Crime Act Grant,


VOCA, which provides support to state and
local programs that assist victims of crime. OCVA received an award amounting to $\$ 1,515,551.04$ for three year period covering October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2025.

This supplemental request before you appropriates funds in the amount of $\$ 505,183.68$ from the New York State Office of Victim Services. This supplemental appropriation request was previously before this Body in September of 2022 and was approved. It is being represented solely due to an administrative change in the Department Code.

The total revenue and expenses are equal. There is no impact on the operating budget.

CHAIRWOMAN FORD: All right. Any debate or discussion?

LEGISLATGOR MULE: Hi, Jeanine. I have a question. So you said the original

amount was 1,500 , something or other, and so is this one year's worth of money? Is that what this is?

MS. DIEHL: That's for the three year period. The one year amount is \$505,000.

LEGISLATGOR MULE: What we're voting on today is for a one year period, correct?

MS. DIEHL: That's correct. Thank
you. I just wanted to understand.

CHAIRWOMAN FORD: Clerk Item number 162-23 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the District Attorney. May have a motion?

Moved by Legislator Mule, seconded by Legislator Bynoe. The item is before us. Good evening.

ADA MCDERMOTT: Dennis McDermott, Assistant District Attorney.

This is a supplemental appropriation request. There are actually five within the ordinance. The first is a $\$ 2,500$ appropriation for the animal cruelty prosecutions. It's from the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, and it's being used specifically to help defray the costs incurred by Bobbi and the Strays for a severe maltreatment, and the case is now pending. It's for $\$ 2,500$.

The next two appropriations are from the Federal Forfeiture program. One for $\$ 7,523$ and the other for $\$ 177,008$. They come from the Department of Justice


Federal Forfeiture Program, and they're used to support enforcement efforts to investigate and prosecute cases.

The last three are from the New York State Civil Forfeiture Programs, one for $\$ 35,101$, one for $\$ 276,019$ and one for $\$ 361,210$. Again, these grants are a result of funds received from successful forfeiture cases, and they're used for investigating and prosecuting other criminal cases. None of these grants require matching funds.

CHAIRWOMAN FORD: It seems like you really were busy and brought in a lot of money. I mean, this is --

ADA MCDERMOTT: Well. In all
honesty, it's total's a little over $\$ 800,000$. And while that sounds like a lot, years ago, we would be bringing in millions. It's up a little this year, but it is trending lower.
