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that normally when we receive grants, we only bring it to the Legislature when the state requires it. Now, this is actually the middle year of a three year grant. Last year they did not require approval. This year they want approval for all three.

It is coming for the Victim Services. It basically supports or funds at least 21 crime victim advocates who serve victims in it, and it averages approximately 1.355 million a year.

LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Are these current employed victim advocates or these new hires?

ADA MCDERMOTT: No, these are now current. The first one was done before this three year grant. Most of them were hired because of this.

LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Okay.

There's a list you can work down to pretty much even regular county court felonies we can use that money for. But it is a large increase and it's for one year.

appropriation of \$50,000 from the New

York State Office of Homeland Security.

This is for the 2023 Operation Gateway

contract.

This program is designed to provide
the NCPD Marine Bureau to enhance border
and water security. The intent is to
curtail illegal activity by executing a
multifaceted enforcement action,
arresting offenders and seizing
contraband. The action is to disrupt and
deter criminal activity.

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Funding of \$39,630 will be used for overtime, and \$10,370 will be used for fringe benefits. This grant does not require a match.

This grant does not require any funding match.

I'm just trying to understand what programmatic aspects does this, or this is not tied to that, where's the budget line to address the actual pedestrian accidents, fatalities, particularly where we are in Baldwin, because we definitely need a traffic study. We've addressed issues with like when Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton, when they had a crossing guard that had a very severe accidental issue. We still have police officers that are patrolling the streets as crossing quards. So this traffic safety issue is something that's significant. So I don't

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know if this is enough money or if we're doing enough about it, because again, we try to protect our children, and our seniors, our police officers and our crossing guards.

So just had a question about that particular item. If it's just for like a salary, in addition to a program that I would really like to see that program or some report on that overall program for that.
