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3               LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Public Safety  
4               Committee will be meeting. Please gather  
5               for the Public Safety Committee meeting,  
6               please.

7               Ask the Clerk to please call the  
8               roll.

9               CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, Mr.  
10              McKevitt.

11              Roll call Public Safety Committee.  
12              Legislator Debra Mule?

13              LEGISLATOR MULE: Here.

14              CLERK PULITZER: Legislator Siela  
15              Bynoe?

16              CLERK PULITZER: Here.

17              Ranking Member Delia  
18              DeRiggi-Whitton?

19              LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Here.

20              CLERK PULITZER: Legislator John  
21              Ferretti?

22              LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Here.

23              CLERK PULITZER: Sitting in today is  
24              Legislator John Giuffre.

25              LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Here.

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2 CLERK PULITZER: Legislator Mazi  
3 Pilip?

4 LEGISLATOR PILIP: Here.

5 CLERK PULITZER: Vice Chairman  
6 Thomas McKevitt?

7 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Here.

8 We have a quorum.

9 CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, sir.

10 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: We have three  
11 items.

12 The first will be 298-23. A  
13 Resolution authorizing the County  
14 Executive to execute a grant agreement  
15 between the County of Nassau, acting on  
16 behalf of the Nassau County District  
17 Attorney and the New York State Office of  
18 Victim Services.

19 Moved by Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton,  
20 seconded by Legislator Ferretti.

21 ADA MCDERMOTT: Good afternoon,  
22 legislators. Dennis McDermott, Assistant  
23 District Attorney.

24 This is a grant agreement -- it's  
25 really a resolution accepting the grant

1  
2 that normally when we receive grants, we  
3 only bring it to the Legislature when the  
4 state requires it. Now, this is actually  
5 the middle year of a three year grant.  
6 Last year they did not require approval.  
7 This year they want approval for all  
8 three.

9 It is coming for the Victim  
10 Services. It basically supports or funds  
11 at least 21 crime victim advocates who  
12 serve victims in it, and it averages  
13 approximately 1.355 million a year.

14 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Are these  
15 current employed victim advocates or  
16 these new hires?

17 ADA MCDERMOTT: No, these are now  
18 current. The first one was done before  
19 this three year grant. Most of them were  
20 hired because of this.

21 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Okay.

22 Any other questions among the  
23 legislators?

24 (Whereupon, no verbal  
25 response.)

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3           LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT:   Okay.

4           If not, we'll go on to discuss our  
5           next item, which will be 303-23, an  
6           ordinance supplemental to the annual  
7           appropriation ordinance in connection  
8           with District Attorney.

9           Moved by Legislator Pilip and  
10          seconded by Legislator Bynoe.

11          ADA MCDERMOTT:   This is a  
12          supplemental appropriation request of  
13          \$2,572,489 from the District Attorney Aid  
14          to Prosecution Program.

15          It's a fairly large increase from  
16          previous, and it's used basically to fund  
17          the ADA's support staff of those charged  
18          with violent felony offenses.

19          There's a list you can work down to  
20          pretty much even regular county court  
21          felonies we can use that money for. But  
22          it is a large increase and it's for one  
23          year.

24          LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Okay.

25          Any other questions among the

legislators.

(Whereupon, no verbal  
response.)

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1  
2           LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Okay. If not,  
3           our next matter is Clerk Item 306-23, an  
4           ordinance supplemental to the annual  
5           appropriation in connection with the  
6           Nassau County Police Department.

7           So moved by Legislator Giuffre and  
8           seconded by Legislator Mule.

9           DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Good  
10          afternoon, Deputy Inspector Murphy,  
11          Police Department.

12          First item I have is, the Police  
13          Department requests the supplemental  
14          appropriation of \$50,000 from the New  
15          York State Office of Homeland Security.  
16          This is for the 2023 Operation Gateway  
17          contract.

18          This program is designed to provide  
19          the NCPD Marine Bureau to enhance border  
20          and water security. The intent is to  
21          curtail illegal activity by executing a  
22          multifaceted enforcement action,  
23          arresting offenders and seizing  
24          contraband. The action is to disrupt and  
25          deter criminal activity.

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2 Funding of \$39,630 will be used for  
3 overtime, and \$10,370 will be used for  
4 fringe benefits. This grant does not  
5 require a match.

6 Any questions?

7 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Any questions  
8 from the legislators?

9 (Whereupon, no verbal  
10 response.)

11 DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Okay. Next  
12 one.

13 Police Department requests a  
14 supplemental appropriation for \$172,500  
15 from New York State Governor's Traffic  
16 Safety Committee.

17 This program is designed to provide  
18 funding for participation in the Buckle  
19 Up Seatbelt Enforcement Initiative and  
20 Aggressive Driving Campaigns. This  
21 program will allow Nassau County to be  
22 reimbursed for overtime in the amount of  
23 \$172,500.

24 This grant does not require any  
25 funding match.

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2                   LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Any questions  
3 from the legislators?

4                   Legislator Giuffre?

5                   LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Deputy  
6 Inspector, for the \$50,000 grant, I was  
7 going to ask you what can you get for  
8 \$50,000, but you answered it. You're  
9 going to do \$39,000 in overtime, \$10,000  
10 in fringe benefits. But for the \$172,000,  
11 it's all over time, and there's no  
12 breakdown between time and fringe?

13                  DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: No, it's  
14 all in overtime.

15                  LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Okay.

16                  Yeah. Aggressive driving. I would  
17 love to see some people get pulled over  
18 who are, like, running some of us off the  
19 road, so to speak.

20                  DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: That the  
21 seatbelt enforcement saves lives.

22                  LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Right.  
23 Absolutely. Thank you. You answered my  
24 questions.

25                  DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Thank you.

Any other questions?

LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Legislator  
DeRiggi-Whitton?

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Can you  
get pulled over if you don't have your  
seatbelts on or does there have to be  
another violation included?

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: No. An  
observation of seat belt is required by  
New York State Law.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: So if  
someone does not have their seatbelt on,  
that's reason enough to be pulled over?

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Yes it is.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Okay, I  
wasn't sure about that.

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Yes.

LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Legislator  
Ferretti?

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: How are you  
doing? Just one quick question. New York  
State Law is now rear seat belts are  
required for all ages, correct?

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Correct.

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LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: We're enforcing that as well?

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Sure.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Okay. Are we doing any outreach to let people know about that or can we if we're not?

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: We could, but there should be some education part of it also.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Yeah, absolutely. I know I heard that I wasn't exactly sure if it was in effect yet, but I know if I didn't know then a lot of people probably don't know.

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Well, you see the "Click It Or Ticket" campaigns they put on right? The commercials.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Okay. Thank you.

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Last one?

LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Yes.

DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Okay.

Police Department is requesting supplemental appropriation in the sum of

1  
2 \$65,000 from the New York State  
3 Governor's Traffic Safety Committee.

4 This program is designed to provide  
5 funding of \$65,000 to the Department to  
6 reduce the number of pedestrian injuries  
7 and deaths involved in motor vehicles  
8 occurring in New York State.

9 The funding of \$65,000 will be set  
10 aside for overtime. There is no required  
11 matching for this funding.

12 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Any other  
13 questions among the legislators?

14 (Whereupon, no verbal  
15 response.)

16 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Okay. Hearing  
17 none.

18 Thank you.

19 DEPUTY INSPECTOR MURPHY: Thank you  
20 very much.

21 LEGISLATOR MCKEVITT: Any public  
22 comment on the three items that we've  
23 discussed today?

24 If there's not, our first vote will  
25 be on --

(Whereupon, public comment.)

MS. MEREDAY: Yes. Good afternoon,  
Meta J. Mereday.

I just had a question with regard to  
the the last one about the traffic  
safety, because it said it was addressing  
pedestrian, I guess, accidents,  
fatalities, but it just spoke about, I  
think, a salaried item, if I'm not  
mistaken.

I'm just trying to understand what  
programmatic aspects does this, or this  
is not tied to that, where's the budget  
line to address the actual pedestrian  
accidents, fatalities, particularly where  
we are in Baldwin, because we definitely  
need a traffic study. We've addressed  
issues with like when Legislator  
DeRiggi-Whitton, when they had a crossing  
guard that had a very severe accidental  
issue. We still have police officers that  
are patrolling the streets as crossing  
guards. So this traffic safety issue is  
something that's significant. So I don't

1  
2 know if this is enough money or if we're  
3 doing enough about it, because again, we  
4 try to protect our children, and our  
5 seniors, our police officers and our  
6 crossing guards.

7 So just had a question about that  
8 particular item. If it's just for like a  
9 salary, in addition to a program that I  
10 would really like to see that program or  
11 some report on that overall program for  
12 that.

13 Thank you.
