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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: At this time
I'll call the Public Works and Parks
Committee to order. I'll ask the Clerk
to call the roll.

CLERK PULITZER: Thank you,
Chairman. Public Works and Parks roll
call.

Legislator Carrie Solages?

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Filling in for
Legislator Arnold Drucker is Delia
DeRiggi-Whitton.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON:
Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Ranking Member
Siela Bynoe?

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Legislator James
Kennedy?

LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Legislator Laura
Schaefer?

LEGISLATOR SCHAEFER: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Vice Chairman

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John Giuffre?

LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Chairman C.
William Gaylor, III?

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Present.

CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, sir.
We have a quorum.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: There are three
items on the Agenda today, which are
Clerk Items 302-23, 309-23 and 310-23.

Clerk Item 302-23 is an ordinance
supplemental to the annual
appropriation ordinance in connection
with the Department of Public Works.

May I have a motion? Moved by
Legislator Giuffre, seconded by
Legislator Bynoe.

The item is before us. We have
Commissioner Arnold from the
Administration to speak about this
item.

COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: Good
afternoon. Ken Arnold, Nassau County
Public Works.

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2 302-23 is the annual supplemental
3 appropriation associated with funds
4 received from the federal government in
5 association with planning activities
6 for New York Metropolitan
7 Transportation Council. These funds are
8 used for salaries and contractual
9 services. The Department has seven
10 active projects that these funds will
11 be allocated towards.

12 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: And it's
13 \$450,030?

14 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: Yes, 300 of
15 which is for contractual services.

16 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Is there any
17 debate or discussion?

18 Yes, ma'am.

19 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Ken,
20 we're testing your memory. Do you know
21 the seven locations?

22 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: It's in the
23 memo that's attached.

24 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: I
25 don't have it in front of me.

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2 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: So they're
3 progression studies that are ongoing
4 for Signal's Sustainability Study; Lido
5 Beach Multi Use Path is one project; we
6 have the Nassau/Queen's Interface
7 Transportation Study; Shared mobility;
8 Land use, we haven't started that one
9 yet; Land Use Transportation Element
10 and Comprehensive Plan; and we have the
11 Electrical Vehicle Fleet Conversion
12 Electrical Charging Station work that
13 we're doing.

14 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any other
15 debate or discussion?

16 (Whereupon, no verbal response.)

17 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any public
18 comment?

19 MS. MEREDAY: Meta J. Mereday.

20 With regard to this, I'm
21 concerned with asking if we have or if
22 we are pursuing funding to address the
23 issue on the trains, particularly Long
24 Island Railroad. The painting of these
25 trains, on the overpasses, the rust is

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2 becoming more and more apparent. I'm
3 just concerned about the overall
4 undergirding of these structures. Is
5 there any type of funding that's in
6 place or that are are any of those
7 contractual arrangements focused on
8 studies to address that before we have
9 any more environmental concerns or
10 possible derailment issues? I mean,
11 just the stability of the trains and
12 it's very unsightly. I see the people
13 are putting posters, big signage across
14 the the railroad, but you can see
15 underneath that it looks very blighted
16 -- well, in some communities. I can
17 only speak for where we are. That would
18 be my question for that one. I thought,
19 were you going to do all three at the
20 same time? But since you asked me.

21 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: I think that's
22 a that's a very, very great question. I
23 know that the train station in my area
24 is the same way. They need work. I
25 believe, though, that it's the MTA and

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2 the Long Island Railroad who actually
3 does the inspection on those. The
4 underpinnings and the undersides of
5 these bridge platforms --

6 MS. MEREDAY: Right. But *Newsday*
7 just did a story about that in terms of
8 the extensive damage. Because
9 particularly a lot of the rain, even
10 though we didn't have a lot of snow,
11 but a lot of the heat causes a lot of
12 the peeling of that paint. That gives
13 you the impression that the bridge
14 crossings are safe. But there's a
15 problem. So just again, we just want to
16 make sure that we spotlight that ahead
17 of time. You know, now that we live in
18 Sinkhole Alley, I would like to make
19 sure that our train overpasses are
20 secure.

21 Thank you.

22 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Thank you. Any
23 other public comment?

24 (Whereupon, no verbal response.)

25 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,

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please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of the
Public Works and Parks Committee
respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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2 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Second item on
3 our Calendar, Clerk Item 309-23 is an
4 ordinance to amend Ordinance 75-2022,
5 adopting the Capital Budget for the
6 County of Nassau for the first year of
7 the four year Capital Plan to commence
8 on January 1st, 2023, pursuant to the
9 provisions of Section 310 of the County
10 Government Law of Nassau County.

11 Can I have a motion, please? Move
12 by Legislator Schaefer, seconded by
13 Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton.

14 The item is before us.
15 Commissioner Arnold?

16 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: 309 is a
17 Capital Budget amendment as stated for
18 the 2023 Capital Plan. This amendment
19 adds \$850,000 to Capital project 52028,
20 which is the Hazardous Material Vehicle
21 Replacement program.

22 The Office of the Fire Marshal is
23 looking to replace two high axle water
24 vehicle rescue vehicles. The current
25 vehicles are at the end of their useful

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2 life, so this funding is to do that.
3 The reason for the amendment and not
4 waiting for new capital plan as these
5 vehicles have a year lead time to
6 purchase. So we want to get ahead of
7 that and get it done as soon as
8 possible.

9 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: So the two
10 existing vehicles we have will stay in
11 service for at least another year until
12 these new replacements?

13 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: That is our
14 goal to keep them in service. The
15 challenge is that the existing vehicles
16 are military vehicles and they're much
17 more complicated to manage.

18 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: What happens to
19 those two military vehicles?

20 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: They have
21 to be returned back to the military, I
22 believe. Yes.

23 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Do they?
24 Interesting.

25 Any debate or discussion?

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(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any public
comment? Ms. Mereday?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,
please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of the
Public Works and Parks Committee
respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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2 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Last item on
3 the Calendar is Clerk Item 310-23 which
4 is a bond ordinance providing for a
5 capital expenditure to finance the
6 capital projects identified herein
7 within the County of Nassau, and
8 authorizing \$850,000 of bonds of the
9 County of Nassau to finance said
10 expenditure pursuant to the Local
11 Finance Law of New York and the County
12 Government law of Nassau County.

13 May I have a motion? Moved by
14 Legislator Kennedy, seconded by
15 Legislator Solages.

16 The item is before us.
17 Commissioner Arnold?

18 COMMISSIONER ARNOLD: As stated,
19 310 is the bond ordinance for the item
20 we just discussed as part of the
21 amendment. The bond also allows the
22 Department to immediately put forth a
23 purchase order, because the funding
24 will be made available for the purchase
25 of these two high axle vehicles.

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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any debate or
discussion?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any public
comment?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,
please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of the
Public Works and Parks Committee
respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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2 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: There being no
3 further business before the Committee,
4 may I have a motion to adjourn?

5 Moved by Legislator Giuffre,
6 seconded by Legislator Bynoe.

7 All in favor?

8 (Whereupon, all members of the
9 Public Works and Parks Committee
10 respond in favor with, "Aye".)

11 CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Committee is
