Item 304-23 is a supplemental appropriation for additional increase in the state and federal aid for the fiscal year 2023. It is being allocated to fund the nonprofit agencies programs like nutrition, senior centers, case management, home health aides, respite caregiver programs. It will be allocated

13	might bring to them or
14	MS. ZAKI: At the senior centers,
15	the congregate meals and the home
16	delivered meals at their homes.

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I'm just curious, again, with regard to the overall reporting at the end of the year where these programs are getting the most impact, or where there may be gaps that are not being addressed.

Particularly, when we talk about a number of senior centers that do not have this type of programming or access for its local residents. So I'm just hoping that there is someone on the Committee that's addressing this, and it's nice to see that there's something on this agenda item.

Again, it's very disheartening to come here and we're killing trees for a number of these Committees that have yet to have any type of listing or agenda item, particularly Veteran Services, Minority Affairs, etcetera.

So I'm concerned, again, that we've got funded programs that are just not getting into the communities that need them the most. And there doesn't seem to be any kind of tracking or oversight to

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determine, okay, this is where we are lacking, this is what we need to do about it. And we have people who are literally starving in their homes or cannot get to the noted facilities, or I should say, the well connected facilities to get these much needed resources. And we have a lot of residents, particularly our seniors and our veterans and those with physical challenges who can't get to a lot of these facilities. And again, I don't see any type of programs in place to provide them with that access. So I'm just putting it out there.

Again, I'm in support of this, but again, we need to be a little bit more effective and efficient as well as inclusive.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: John, do you mind?

CHAIRMAN GIUFFRE: Sure.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Do you know of any senior center that doesn't

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have this program with the subsidized lunches? I mean, if you can send us a list of those. Normally the Meals on Wheels would be affiliated with that. So all the senior centers that I've been involved with for a long time have this, even smaller ones. If you ever hear of one that doesn't have this program, let

MS. MEREDAY: Okay. But also my concern is that the County is not coordinating with the Town with regard to its senior facilities that, again, could be a stronger impact to reach a lot of the residents as far as access.

LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: the way I understand it, all the senior centers basically get their funding, a lot of them, from the County. That's why they have to keep the tracking and everything, like Glen Cove, for instance, so they subsidize the lunches. A really good lunch is \$3. It would normally probably cost like 8 to 10, but because
