CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: The Rules are suspended.

We will proceed with the Consent Calendar. These are all items that have gone through previous Committee, and the Majority and Minority have agreed that there is no further debate or discussion required. Those items are 323; 324; 328;

(Whereupon, off record discussion.)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: I'm told that 338
is not on the Consent Calendar, so we'll
just take that one out.
341, 342 and 343, motion on those items is made by Ms. Pilip and seconded by Mr. Solages.

All those in favor of those items, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of the Finance Committee respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Those items have passed unanimously. Thank you.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 325 is provides issuance to warrants directing the Treasurer of the County to pay supervisors of various towns and villages deposits from mortgage taxes for the year commencing October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Motion by Mr. Drucker and seconded by Mr. McKevitt.

Any questions on that item?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: All those in favor of 325, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: That's unanimous. Thank you.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 338 is a resolution to authorize a transfer of appropriations for the year 2023.

Motion by Mr. McKevitt and seconded by Ms. Pilip.

MS. ZOHRABIAN: Good afternoon. Alyssa Zohrabian, Nassau County Department of Health.

Item 338-23 contains a board transfer in the amount of $\$ 58,203$ to maximize grant funding in the STD Disease Intervention services grant. Savings and salary and supplies will be utilized to cover additional fringe. The program is 100\% grant funded.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Thank you. Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Okay. Thank you.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 341 is an ordinance connection with the Department of Human Services.

Motion by Mr. McKevitt, seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MS. ZAKI: Good afternoon, Legislators. Seema Zaki, Department of Human Services.

Item number 349-23 --
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: 341.
MS. ZAKI: Oh. I'm sorry. Let me get my papers.

Item 341-23 has multiple annual appropriations. These are for Office of Mental Health and Office of Chemical Dependency state mandated programs 100\% backed by the state and federal funding. The first appropriation is for $\$ 23,466,200$. This is funded by New York State Oasis for the calendar year 2024. This is to provide programs and services to medically supervised outpatient programs, gambling prevention, opioid programs, and it also includes funding to
all the school districts.
The second appropriation is an annual supplemental appropriation --

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Are we still
talking about 341?
MS. ZAKI: Yeah. There are five items under 341.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Got it. Go on, please.

MS. ZAKI: The second one is for $\$ 5,452,475$. It's for 2024 calendar year. This is again funding for the Methadone Maintenance Clinic run by the County for the calendar year 2024.

The third item is for $\$ 4,427,935$.
This is 100\% state funded by New York State Office of Mental Health. This program provides mental health and chemical dependency treatment for children.

And the fourth item, which is for $\$ 16,259,005$. This is again for the calendar year 2024 for Office of New York State, funded through Office of Mental
$\qquad$

Health. These programs and services are provided to adults with mental health, mental health illnesses, and chemical dependency disorders.

And lastly, the fifth item under 341
is for $\$ 286,102$, which is for the calendar year 2023, funded through New York State Office of Mental Health for the cost of living increase of $\$ 286,102$.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: All those in favor of 341, please say, "Aye".)
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Thank you very much.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: 342 is supplemental ordinance with the Probation Department.

Motion by Mr. Solages, seconded by Ms. Pilip.
(Whereupon, off record discussion.)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Never mind. I'm sorry. I'm told this was by consent. We already called this. So you're done.

Number 344, Department of Parks.
Motion by Ms. Pilip and seconded by Mr. Solages.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Good afternoon again. Darcy Belyea, Parks Commissioner.

Number 344-23 is designating Nassau County as our own tourism promotion agency in 2024, allowing us to receive grant funds from Empire State Development, I Love New York matching grant program, to promote tourism in Nassau County. The amount we are to receive for 2024 after this is approved would be $\$ 52,514$. The County match will come from existing funds we currently use
for advertising through our contract with
the Ed Moore Agency.
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: All those in favor
of those items, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Thank you.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: 349, is transfer of appropriations.

Motion by Mr. McKevitt, seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MS. ZAKI: Good afternoon, Legislators. Seema Zaki, Department of Human Services.

Item number 349-23 is a transfer of $\$ 100,000$ for the calendar year 2023 from adult into the children's grant. These funds will be allocated to the cost of living increase for the children's program agencies.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: All those in favor of those items, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 350 is a resolution making certain determinations pursuant to SEQRA authorizing the renewal of an option extending the term of the lease between Steele LOS III, Limited partnership as landlord and the county of Nassau tenant in connection with 42,980 rentable square feet at 700 Hicksville Road in Bethpage.

Motion by Mr. Kennedy, seconded by Mr. McKevitt.

MR. WALSH: Good afternoon, Legislators. Kevin Walsh, Office of Real Estate Services.

This is an item which is enabling the County to exercise a second renewal option for the County's OEM warehouse lease in Bethpage. This warehouse stores critical emergency equipment for the County, and most recently, it also served as a logistics center during the pandemic to store PPE and so forth.

The terms actually, it's the time of the essence. The lease doesn't expire to


May 31st of next year, but there's a six month requirement to give notice, which we'd have to exercise by December 1st. So it's timing is critical here so we don't lose this opportunity.

The new rental rate is based pursuant to the lease based on $95 \%$ of fair market value. We have an appraisal included in the package. And actually the landlord gave us a little bit less better than $95 \%$ of fair market value. So any questions?

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Hearing none, all those in favor, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: That is unanimous.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 356, which is supplemental with the Police Department.

Motion by Ms Pilip, seconded by Mr. Drucker.

I don't think we've got any issues, I'm told. Do you guys have any issues with this one? It should have been on the Consent Calendar. Okay. In that case, all those in favor of 356 , please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Thank you.


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 357 is supplemental to modify certain departmental budgets.

Motion by Mr. Solages, second and Mr. McKevitt.

MR. PERSICH: Good afternoon, Andy Persich, Office of Management and Budget.

Item 357 is a quarterly board transfer to realign the budget for 2023. It's a component of many different items. It's a large transfer in supplemental. Includes money for additional police overtime funds, Department of Social Services, additional needs in the SNAP and HEAP programs, Early Intervention, and the balance is to fund the CSEA agreement that we've just ratified. So I'm here to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: All those in favor of those items, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Number 329 and 330. 329 is Mogilski versus County of Nassau; 330 is Nicole Thompson versus County of Nassau and Henry Kramer. Those are settlements.

Motion on those are made by Mr. McKevitt, seconded by Mr. Solages.

Motion to go into Executive Session is made by Mr. McKevitt and seconded by Mr. Solages.

All those in favor of Executive Session on those two items, please say, "Aye".
(Whereupon, all members of the Finance Committee respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any opposed?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: We're going into Executive Session to which the members of Rules are invited as well.
(Whereupon, Executive
Session, 3:18-3:35 p.m.)


CHAIRMAN KOPEL: We have one more item in Finance and that would be number 355 which is the SEQRA determination relevant to a third amendment to a lease between County of Nassau and Jamaica Village Owner, LLC for property known as. One State Street, 32nd floor, New York, New York for use by NICE bus service. Motion is made by Mr. McKevitt, seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MR. WALSH: Good afternoon again, Legislators. Kevin Walsh from the Office of Real Estate Services.

This is an extension of an recently respired lease for the Jamaica Bus Service that's operated by NICE in Jamaica, Queens. This is the bus service station that the County shares along with the MTA. We have about six bus bays there. This extension will extend the lease for nine months, with the potential for it to go up through the end of 2024. As this is going on, we're also looking to move to a potential other location in
the Jamaica, Queens vicinity, and that lease is under negotiation right now. But this will at least give us time to work through that process.

CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Okay. Thank you. Any questions?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Yes, Chair of the Committee.

Good afternoon, sir.
MR. WALSH: Good afternoon, Legislator.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Recently at a hearing in which the contract for the bus company was passed, a constituent of mine by the name of Ms. Dorsey complained that when she is commuting back from New York City, back to Elmont, that she would wait at times over 40 minutes at the Jamaica train station. Does this depot, bus depot, for lack of better word, this is have to do anything with the poor response times with these buses leaving
$\qquad$
the Jamaica area. Is anyone here from a NICE bus corporation?

MR. WALSH: I can't speak to that honestly. I have not involved in the operations of it only on the lease aspect of the extension.

I do know that we're looking at another alternative location. I don't know if it's late because of its vicinity. Like I said, it's a busy terminal because we use six bus bays. My understanding is there's about 18. I think there's another six used by the MTA in New York City Transit bus.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Is there anyone here from the NICE Bus Corporation that could answer this question?

MR. WALSH: I don't believe so. I could have someone from DPW.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Please. Because again, my constituents are suffering because NICE bus corporation, which we just passed a multi-million dollar corporation for over for seven years or

six years, unfortunately is not providing adequate bus service to my constituency.

And Mr. Jack Khzouz promised everything under the sun when he was here, and nothing has been done. And every day since that hearing, the bus has been late, 40 minutes every day. Please, is there anyone that can speak about this?

MR. WALSH: I'm just going to
introduce Sharon Persuad, Deputy
Commissioner of Public Works.
MS. PERSUAD: Thank you.
With regard to the Jamaica Bus
Terminal and the timing, that's an
everyday situation. We have no control
over that. So even you're mentioning Ms. Dorsey, I believe her name is.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Yes.
MS. PERSUAD: Her situation is quite different to anything dealing with the Jamaica real estate we're talking about here.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: All right. But aren't the buses coming from that real

estate?

MS. PERSUAD: Yes. We have six lines that come out of that particular property. Yes.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: So how could you say that it has nothing to do with that. I mean, I'm sure it's a factor.

MS. PERSUAD: With the Ms. Dorsey piece that you were speaking of, it's two different situations.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: And what exactly is the situation then?

MS. PERSUAD: Mr. Dorsey represents a different situation than the buses coming out of Jamaica.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: I don't understand. She's waiting at Jamaica, waiting over 40 minutes for a bus from this private company that's not providing adequate service and this depot is a factor in it. I just need to understand.

MS. PERSUAD: The depot is where we end and begin the trips. But again, it is not a fixed guideway. So a lot of it
$\qquad$
depends on the roadway. It has really nothing to do with the terminal itself.

That's where we end and begin our trips.
LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Yes, Ms.
Persuad, thank you, I appreciate you.
Can we please have a follow up meeting with my constituents and several other constituents regarding this issue? Please. I've asked for this and nothing has happened.

MS. PERSUAD: Will do.
LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Once you get your contract passed, it's just crickets. So when can we have this meeting, please?

MS. PERSUAD: We will look to
schedule something in the next few weeks, if that's okay with you. Would you like us to contact your office directly?

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Yes, please. Thank you very much.

MS. PERSUAD: All right.
CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Anyone else?
(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)
