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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: At this time I'll call the Public Works and Parks Committee to order. I'll ask the Clerk to call the roll.

CLERK PULITZER: Thank you, sir.
Roll call.

CLERK PULITZER: Legislator Arnold Drucker?

LEGISLATOR DRUCKER: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Ranking Member Siela Bynoe?

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Legislator James Kennedy?

LEGISLATOR KENNEDY: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Legislator Laura Schaefer?

LEGISLATOR SCHAEFER: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Vice Chairman John Giuffre?

LEGISLATOR GIUFFRE: Here.

CLERK PULITZER: Chairman C. William

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Gaylor, III?

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Present.

CLERK PULITZER: We have a quorum,
sir.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Thank you.

We have four items on the agenda
today, which are Clerk Items 323-23;
324-23; 328-23; and 335-23.

Clerk Item 323-23 is an ordinance to
adopt capital budget for the County of
Nassau for the first year of the four
year Capital Plan to commence on January
1, 2024 pursuant to the provisions of
Section 310 of the County Government Law
of Nassau County.

May I have a motion?

Moved by Legislator Giuffre,
seconded by Legislator Bynoe.

So the item is before us. Do we
have somebody from the Administration to
talk about this item?

MR. YANSICK: Chris Yansick, Nassau
County Department of Public Works.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Got it. Thank you

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very much.

Is there any debate or discussion from the Legislators, we're just going to move this along and tee it up.

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: The Minority is joining the Majority in teeing this up as we continue to review the items for Full Legislature.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Okay. Very good. All in favor, signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of the PW and Parks Committee respond in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Those opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Item passes unanimously.

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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Clerk Item 324-23.
A resolution to adopt the Four Year
Capital Plan for the County of Nassau to
commence on January 1, 2024, pursuant to
the provisions of Section 310 of the
County Government Law of Nassau County.

Minority still in the same position,
teeing it up?

Can I have a motion?

Moved by Legislator Schaefer,
seconded by Legislator Solages.

The item is before us. I understand
we are just going to pass this along
again?

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Same comment
applies to this item.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,
please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of
the Public Works and Parks
Committee respond in favor
with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

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(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The third item on the Calendar today is Clerk Item 328-23, a resolution authorizing the County of Nassau to participate in a transportation project providing for the re-striping of various county roads under Capital Project H62I53-015, pin number 0761.69, and authorizing the County Executive of the County of Nassau to execute the agreement on behalf of the County with the New York State Department of Transportation for the advancement of said aid for transportation projects in Nassau County.

May I have a motion?

Moved by Legislator Kennedy, seconded by Legislator Drucker. Thank you.

The item is before us.

MR. LUTZ: Good afternoon, Harold Lutz, Nassau County Department of Public Works.

328-23 allows the County Executive to sign and execute the agreement with

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New York State Department of
Transportation so that we can receive
federal funds for our pavement marking
Phase 15 project.

Without the approval of the master
agreement, we cannot receive the federal
funding. It is approximately \$4 million
contract. Once we bid it, 80% of that is
reimbursable by the State of New York and
FHWA. It's approximately 80 miles of
roadway that will be re striping
completely from curb to curb.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any debate or
discussion?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any public
comment?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,
please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of
the Public Works and Parks

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Committee respond in favor
with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Clerk Item 335-23
is an ordinance supplemental to the
Annual Appropriation Ordinance in
connection with Department of Parks,
Recreation and Museums.

May I have a motion?

Moved by Legislator Schaefer,
seconded by Legislator Bynoe. The item
is before us.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Good afternoon
again. Darcy Belyea, Parks Commissioner.

The Department is requesting
approval of a supplemental appropriation
in the amount of \$1,683,500. These funds
represent the annual amount of fees
anticipated to be collected at the County
Shooting Range and the Mitchel Park
Athletic Complex Track and field
programs. The US Department of Interior
has directed the county to segregate any
fees collected by the Mitchel Athletic
Complex, to be in a dedicated fund for
the use for recreational purposes. There

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is no net impact on the budget, since they will recognize an equal amount of revenue and expenses.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Just out of curiosity, who collects more of the pistol range or the soccer fields -- athletic fields?

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Hang on. I could guess, but I'll tell you facts. Rent of County property 189,000. Rifle range fees 777,500. So actually a close mix because the athletic field charges for 480, so it's almost half and half.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Okay. Interesting.

Any debate a discussion?

Legislator by Bynoe.

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Thank you.

Hi, Commissioner. So we take in a certain amount of revenue and you're saying we spend an equal amount?

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Exactly. Because part of the arrangement for the

2 County to hold that property with the
3 Department of Interior is that we fund a
4 separate account, which is an operating
5 account. So out of there is paid some
6 salaries (perusing), wages, fringe
7 benefits, equipment and some contractual
8 services.

9 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Do we invest in
10 that park at all?

11 COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Do we invest
12 in that park? We do.

13 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Is there an
14 operating budget that that actually not
15 everything goes to capital where we're
16 just doing some level of --

17 COMMISSIONER BELYEA: So that whole
18 property is all out of this fund except
19 for capital improvements, separate.
20 That's the capital borrow.

21 LEGISLATOR BYNOE: I think this is
22 the one park that I may have in my
23 district. It's not utilized as a regular
24 park, but I'd like to see how we might be
25 able to allow community to use that park

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a little more often.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: I've been trying to use the admin building. The Youth Bureau has been using it. Minority Affairs, Asian American Affairs has been using the admin building meeting space. But I'm open to any ideas you may have.

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: Yeah, I actually, I'll tell you, I've been real deliberate in trying to get to every single asset of the County. I will tell you, I've never been here.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Let me know, I'll meet you there. Give you a private tour.

LEGISLATOR BYNOE: I would like that. Very good. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Legislator Solages.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Good afternoon. You mentioned that there was a need for segregation of, I guess, funds. Why is that the case? Was there ever an incident of any sort of misappropriation that led

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to some sort of notice by that source that there should be a segregation of funding?

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: No, it was part of the original agreement between the County and the Department of the Interior, which is federally owned property, one of the mandates of the agreement.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Before there was no segregation of funding.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: No, there has been. It's just an annual request, but it has to be approved by all of you.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Okay. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: I think that relationship with the Department of Interior goes back to when all the Mitchel Field was owned by the federal government and the airfield was there.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Correct.

LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: I used to go to the commissary there with my dad all the

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time.

COMMISSIONER BELYEA: It's still
open. Still functions.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Thank you.

Any public comment?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: All in favor,
please signify by saying, "Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of
the Public Works and Parks
Committee respond in favor
with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: Any opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: The item passes
unanimously.

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CHAIRMAN GAYLOR: There is no further business before the Committee.
