24 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Passed 7 to 0.
25 We now have three new items on

3 both transfer of appropriations made to.
4 I'll ask for a motion right now from
5 Legislator Kennedy and second by
6 Legislator Koslow.

7 MR. DELANEY: Thomas Delaney, Office
8 of Emergency Management. Here to
9 represent number 13-24.

10 This is a simple board transfer.
11 Moving or reclassifying funding from DD
12 line to BB.

13 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any further
14 questions?

15 (Whereupon, no verbal
16 response.)

17 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: On to number 14.

2 INSPECTOR FIELD: Good afternoon,
3 William Field, Inspector with the Police
4 Department.

5 Item 14-24 is a board transfer. It's
6 part of our SAVE Grant, our Surveillance
7 Apprehension Vehicle Enforcement Program
8 grant. We're looking to move some
9 funding from our general expense line to
10 our salary line in order to maximize our
11 reimbursement.

12 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any questions
13 from the legislators?

14 (Whereupon, no verbal
15 response.)

16 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: If not, thank
17 you very much.

2 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: We have one
3 further new item, which is Item 21-24,
4 which was an issue of a warrant directing
5 the Treasurer to pay supervisors and the
6 cities and villages regarding our
7 mortgage recording taxes.

8 LEGISLATOR WALKER: So moved.

9 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: So moved by
10 Legislator Walker, second by Legislator
11 Ferretti.

12 Is there anyone here to speak on
13 behalf of this, or are we just going to
14 ordinarily claim the money like we do
15 every year? We'll take a few words of
16 support.

17 MS. CARLSON: Helen Carlson, Office
18 of Legislative Budget Review.

19 This resolution represents the
20 quarterly allocation of the mortgage
21 recording tax collections. It covers
22 October 1, 2023 through December 31,
23 2023. It is for 7.2 million to be
24 distributed to the towns, villages and
25 cities in Nassau. For the quarter,

collections have decreased roughly 30%.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Not enough house closings. That's the problem.

MS. CARLSON: Exactly.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: No joke. Wait for the interest rates come down.

Any further comment by legislators?

A question from Mr. Ferretti.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Good afternoon.

The reduction is 30% from a year ago, correct?

MS. CARLSON: It's for this quarter compared to last year's quarter, correct.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: To previous quarter.

MS. CARLSON: Yes.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Okay. Got it.

Do you have the number from the previous year, that same quarter?

MS. CARLSON: Not in front me. It's down 7.2 million, but I don't have the number in front of me.

LEGISLATOR FERRETTI: Okay. Thank

you.

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any public
comments?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Okay. If not,
then we'll take a vote on numbers 13, 14,
21.

All in favor, please, by saying,
"Aye".

(Whereupon, all members of
the Finance Committee respond
in favor with, "Aye".)

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Opposed?

(Whereupon, no verbal
response.)

CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Passed
unanimously, 7 to 0.

Thank you very much.

Legislator Walker, second by Legislator
Davis.

2 At this point, we'll actually make
3 Items 40 and 41. I have a motion from
4 Legislator Kennedy, second by Legislator
5 Koslow.

6 Commissioner Belyea, we have, I
7 believe, two Parks items on for the
8 Addendum, 40 and 41.

9 COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Good afternoon
10 again. Darcy Belyea, Parks Commissioner.

11 40-24 is a Hotel/Motel Tax Grant
12 Agreement between the County and Franklin
13 Square Historical Society. The requested
14 amount of funding is \$15,000.

15 The purpose of the agreement is to
16 be used to pay for an architect to
17 develop plans for a classroom extension
18 on the rear of their museum. As they
19 expand their outreach to school groups,
20 this new space will allow them to better
21 serve these groups and also provide
22 meeting space for community groups.

23 The term of this agreement is
24 October 1, 2023, ending on September 30,
25 2024, and the funding source is the

2 Hotel/Motel Tax Grant fund. Any
3 questions?

4 (Whereupon, no verbal
5 response.)

6 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Number 41.

7 COMMISSIONER BELYEA: Item 41 is
8 another Hotel/Motel Tax Grant Agreement
9 between the County and Seaford Historical
10 Society.

11 Requested amount of the funding is
12 \$50,000. The purpose is that they are in
13 need of a roof replacement. The existing
14 roof is currently leaking into areas of
15 the parlor which displays priceless
16 items. They need to replace the entire
17 roof, they've been told.

18 The term of this agreement is
19 January 1, 2024, ending December 31,
20 2024. Funding again, Hotel/Motel Tax
21 Grant Fund.

22 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Is there any
23 discussion among legislators?

24 (Whereupon, no verbal
25 response.)

2 CHAIRMAN MCKEVITT: Any public
