

Hands-on learning, exploring, activities, experiments, scavenger hunts and arts & crafts for children 5-7 & 8-11 years old. Tuesday – Friday 9:30am-12:30pm & 1-4pm OR 9:30am-4:00pm

JR. NATURE SERIES I & II is geared towards children 5-7 years old with age-appropriate hands-on learning including exploring ecosystems, sounds & colors of nature, puppet shows/plays, scavenger hunts, experiments, arts & crafts, educational film & more!

JR. NATURE I (Ages 5-7 only): Pond Life Discovery; Understanding flowers; Intro to birds & observing birds; Insects, bugs & spiders JR. NATURE II (Ages 5-7 only): Beach Exploration; Animal habitats, life cycles & food chains; Woodland wonders: Trees; Intro to Gardening

<u>NATURE SERIES I & II</u> is geared toward older students ages 8-11 and goes into more detailed analysis and handson exploration including hands-on discovery, taking measurements, experiments, scavenger hunts, crafts, educational film & more!

Daily schedule: Age-appropriate hands-on learning session (topic varies daily), snack break with ½ hr. film, arts and crafts, experiment & activities. Workshops are held indoors and outdoors.

MORNING (9:30am-12:30pm) & AFTERNOON (1-4pm) sessions available. \$150 per CHILD for FOUR AM or PM SESSIONS. CHILDREN CAN STAY FOR 4 FULL DAYS for \$300/CHILD. Advance Registration & pre-payment required.

July 3: SUMMERTIME BIRD WALK

What are birds up during summertime? Most have finished nesting and are raising their young, some have already left the nest. Explore the woods and field to discover the less known lives of birds after their spring arrival! Binoculars provided, Ages 6+.

July 10: NATIVE GARDENING FOR BIRDS & POLLINATORS

Learn about native plants and how beneficial they are for native birds and pollinators and how to encourage them in your own backyard. Ages 8+

July 17: ALL ABOUT WEATHERING & EROSION

Observe how water sculpts the landscape! Explore the beach for signs of erosion, weathering and more unique geological phenomena of our preserve. Ages 7+

July 24: POND LIFE DISCOVERY

With buckets, nets & magnifiers, join us as we dip into the world of the pond! Observe small animals & insects that live in the pond and learn all about their life cycles. Wear sneakers. All ages.

July 31: BEACH EXPLORATION

Explore the shoreline at Garvies beach along Hempstead Harbor. Search for crabs, clams, mussels, & more as we learn about this interesting environment! Hands-on exploration for children and adults of all ages. Sneakers recommended.

August 7: BUTTERFLY & INSECT STUDY

Join us as we explore our field and gardens environments in search of a variety of insects, butterflies & more! Learn about life cycles and why insects are so important to our ecosystem!_Use bug catchers, magnifiers, nets, & field guides! All ages welcome! Don't forget to visit our beautiful Butterfly & Bird-Friendly habitat gardens during the height of bloom, June-October!

August 14: ANCIENT ANIMALS & LIVING FOSSILS WALK

Take a trip back in time as we discover living fossils on our nature preserve! Ages 7+

August 21: OUTDOOR SURVIVAL 101

Learn knot-tying, navigation & signaling, fire-making, first aid, hazardous plants & animals, identify edible plants – roots, shoots, berries & more! Recommended 8+.

Brief History of Museum & Preserve

As early as 2500 B.C. Matinecock Natives occupied a sheltered campsite on the south side of the property, adjacent to what was then a marsh. This was a small seasonal site with fewer than 50 individuals who were primarily hunters and gatherers of wild foods such as shellfish. This area was included in the tract of land purchased in 1668 by Joseph Carpenter of Warwick, Rhode Island. It became part of the Garvie family estate when Dr. Thomas Garvie, a physician and founder of this prominent Long Island family, emigrated here from Scotland in 1803. The land was purchased by Nassau County in 1963. The Museum, which opened on July 4, 1967 specializes in Long Island & NYS geology and LI Native American archaeology along with special exhibits, currently showing, "Seashells...Nature's Inspired Design." Our nature preserve consists of 62 acres with 5 miles of marked trails including a self-guiding trail and trail for the visually impaired. Woodlands of varying ages, meadows, ponds, and 2,000 feet of shoreline along Hempstead Harbor can be explored. Our museum & preserve are known for its rich geological and archaeological history. Trail maps are available at the front entrance and online.
