Robo Pet Distribution for Grandparents Day

Dozens of seniors received a special gift in honor of Grandparents' Day from Nassau County Office for the Aging at the Hispanic Brotherhood of Rockville Centre on September 13th. Seniors in attendance received a Joy for All Robopet. Animatronic pets are much more than a soft, stuffed cat or dog. They react to petting, hugging and motion just as a real pet would, but do not require the feeding, bathroom breaks or grooming that real life pets need. These Animatronic pets are intended to help individuals at risk for social isolation or those with cognitive impairment. The New York State Office of the Aging provided funding for the robotic companions program. The county has already distributed more than 420 of the lifelike robotic cats and dogs to housebound seniors during the COVID-19 pandemic.
