Residents were then afforded an opportunity to ask questions that were pertinent to their individual needs.

#### Body Cameras, Crisis Calls and Third Party Oversight





After filing legislation in 2014 and subsequently dedicating more than seven years of advocacy to the issue, Legislator Bynoe, is pleased to report that Nassau County is on a positive trajectory toward the implementation of an officer-worn body camera program, which would bring this best practice in law enforcement to the nation's 13th largest police force for the first time. Renewed advocacy for body cameras in Nassau followed the May 25, 2020 police-involved murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Minn. -an incident that generated international outrage and sparked passionate demands for increased police oversight and accountability.

Legislator Bynoe is also gratified the County's police reform plan embraces a more holistic approach to mental health crisis calls by expanding the use of its Mobile Crisis Unit. This change was the outgrowth of findings contained in a study completed under the auspices of a law Legislator Bynoe co-introduced and for which she secured unanimous approval last summer.

### **Working to Support Communities**



In addition to targeted community grants, Legislator Bynoe worked to secure commitments that will set the stage for advancing more than \$16.5 million in capital investments across the Second Legislative District upon their completion.
