MWBE- HISPANIC OWNED BUSINESSES

Latino entrepreneurs are starting small businesses faster than the rest of the startup population and becoming a bigger part of the total U.S. market every day. Estimates are that they will make up 29 percent of the U.S. population by 2050, up from 17 percent today. According to a Stanford Graduate School of Business study, if those businesses grew as fast as the U.S. average, they could add \$1.4 trillion to the U.S. economy.

As this important sector grows, in Nassau, the Office of Hispanic Affairs is committed in ensuring that our Hispanic owned businesses have access to vital resources that ensure they continue to flourish. This year, we were proud to team up with key stakeholders in our business community to secure thousands of dollars in funding through programs available at the State and Federal level such as the "New York State Seed Funding", "New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Recovery Grant" and the "Employee Retention Credit".
