SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Preparing in advance will make the scholarship application process smoother and less stressful.

✓ Personal & Academic Documents

- High school transcript (official and/or unofficial copy)
- College transcript (if applicable)
- GPA information
- SAT/ACT scores (if required)
- Proof of enrollment or college acceptance letter
- Student ID number
- Social Security Number (if required)
- Résumé (include academic achievements, leadership roles, internships, volunteer work, and employment)

✓ Letters of Recommendation

- Request letters at least 3–4 weeks in advance
- Provide recommenders with your résumé and scholarship details
- Confirm submission deadlines
- Send a thank-you note after submission

✓ Essays & Personal Statements

- Draft general personal statement (can be tailored for multiple scholarships)
- Prepare short-response versions (250–500 words)
- Have a teacher, mentor, or counselor review your essays
- Proofread for grammar and clarity

✓ Financial Information

- Parent/guardian tax returns (if dependent)
- Student tax return (if applicable)
- Household income information
- FAFSA Submission Summary (if required)

✓ Application Logistics

- Create a spreadsheet to track deadlines
- Confirm submission format (online, email, mail)
- Save confirmation emails
- Submit applications at least 2–3 days before deadline
- Keep copies of everything submitted



PRO TIP

Start requesting recommendation letters at least one month before deadlines. Always save confirmation emails and keep a digital folder of all submitted documents

UNDERSTANDING FINANCIAL AID

A Simple Guide for Students and Families

Paying for college can feel confusing because financial aid comes from different places.

The easiest way to understand it is to think of it as layers of support.

Financial aid generally comes from **three** main sources

1



**Federal Government

1 Layer 1: Federal Aid (FAFSA)

The first step for every student is completing the FAFSA.

FAFSA stands for: **Free Application for Federal Student Aid.**

This application is run by the **U.S. Department of Education.**

When a student completes the FAFSA, they may qualify for federal financial aid such as:

- **Pell Grant** – free money that does not need to be repaid
- **Federal Student Loans** – loans with lower interest rates for students
- **Federal Work-Study** – part-time jobs offered through colleges
- **Campus-based financial aid** provided by colleges

Many state programs and college scholarships use FAFSA to determine eligibility.

This is why FAFSA is always the first step in the financial aid process.

② Layer 2: New York State Aid

After completing the FAFSA, **New York State may provide additional financial aid** to help cover tuition.

New York's financial aid programs are managed by the:
New York State Higher Education Services Corporation (HESC).

Two programs available to New York students are:

Tuition Assistance Program

TAP is NYS's main tuition grant. It provides **free money that does not need to be repaid** to eligible NYS residents attending approved colleges in New York.

To qualify for TAP, students generally must:

- Be a New York State resident
- Attend an approved college in New York
- Be enrolled full-time (usually 12 credits or more)
- Meet income eligibility requirements

Excelsior Scholarship

Excelsior Scholarship helps make tuition at SUNY & CUNY colleges **tuition-free for eligible families**. Excelsior only covers **tuition**. It does not cover housing, books, or other fees. Excelsior is considered a **"last-dollar scholarship."** This means it covers remaining tuition after other financial aid is applied.

Students may qualify if:

- Their household income is \$125,000 or less
- They attend a SUNY or CUNY school
- They attend full-time and complete 30 credits per year

3 Layer 3: Scholarships

After completing the FAFSA and applying for New York State aid, the next important step is to apply for scholarships.

Scholarships are financial awards that do not need to be repaid. They are offered by colleges, nonprofit organizations, companies, foundations, and community groups.

Unlike federal or state aid, scholarships are often based on a variety of factors, including:

- Academic achievement
- Community service
- Leadership and extracurricular involvement
- Career interests or field of study
- Cultural or community background
- Financial need

Some scholarships are large awards that cover tuition, while others may provide smaller amounts that help pay for books, transportation, or school supplies. Even smaller scholarships can make a big difference when combined.

Students should apply to as many scholarships as possible, because every award helps reduce the overall cost of college.

Important Tip

Many scholarships require:

- A personal essay
- Letters of recommendation
- Academic transcripts

IMPORTANT: THE EXACT STEPS TO FOLLOW

1. Create an FSA ID

This allows students and parents to sign the FAFSA electronically.

2. Complete the FAFSA

Visit studentaid.gov and submit the application.

3. Complete the New York State TAP Application

After FAFSA is submitted, students can apply for TAP through the HESC website.

4. Apply for the Excelsior Scholarship (if eligible)

Students attending SUNY or CUNY may apply through HESC.

5. Apply for College and Private Scholarships

Scholarships from organizations, foundations, and colleges can further reduce costs.

6. Check Email Regularly

Financial aid offices may request additional documents.

STEP-BY-STEP FAFSA GUIDE FOR PARENT

Step 1: Create an FSA ID for both the student and parent at studentaid.gov.

Step 2: Gather required documents including Social Security numbers, tax returns, and bank records.

Step 3: Visit studentaid.gov and start the FAFSA application.

Step 4: Enter student demographic information and school choices.

Step 5: Enter parent financial information.

Step 6: Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool when available.

Step 7: Review the application carefully for errors.

Step 8: Sign and submit the FAFSA electronically.

Step 9: Receive the Student Aid Report (SAR).

Step 10: Compare financial aid packages from colleges.

HELPFUL FAFSA TIPS

- Complete the FAFSA as soon as it opens each year.
- List multiple colleges so they can receive the financial aid report.
- Check email regularly for requests for additional documents.
- Ask college financial aid offices for help if needed.
- Reapply every year while the student is in college.

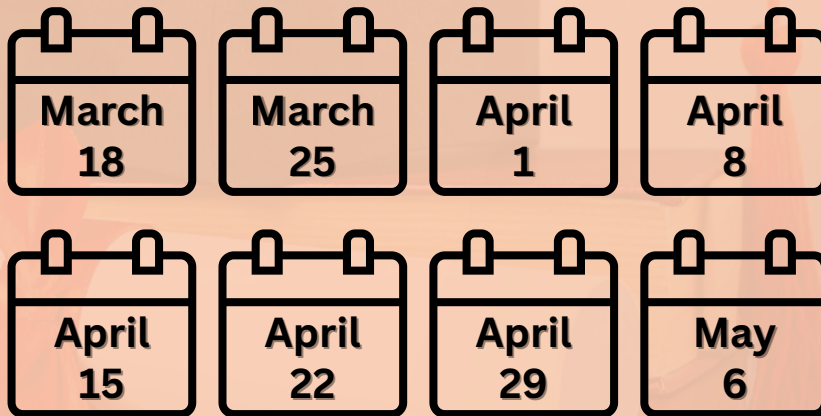

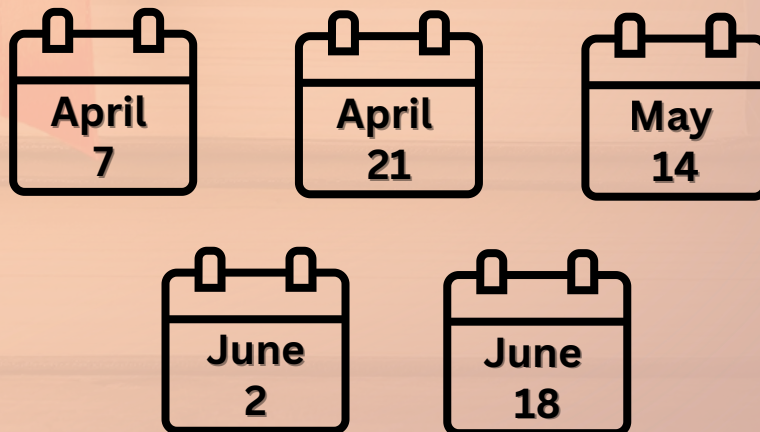

Need Help? College & FAFSA Support Resources

You do not have to navigate the process alone! Start with your high school guidance counselor and the financial aid office at the college you plan to attend, as they can help with applications, FAFSA questions, scholarships, and deadlines. If you are employed, check whether your employer offers tuition assistance or education benefits. Trusted mentors such as teachers, coaches, employers, community leaders, or family friends can also provide valuable guidance and encouragement. The organizations listed on this page offer support with FAFSA completion, scholarship searches, college applications, essay writing, and financial aid questions, and many provide free or bilingual services.
