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National Family Caregiver Support Program

Program Information:

The Goal of the **National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP)** is to help sustain the ability of family Caregivers and other informal Caregiver supports to care for their loved ones, while promoting the ability of care receivers to remain safe and independent in their own homes and communities.

The program is to help increase the Caregiver access to community based services by helping them navigate the service system and providing the information and support necessary for them to access services.



Services Available:

An assessment will be conducted by a Case Manager. If the Case Manager finds it appropriate, the Caregiver will receive Respite Services.

Case Managers will assist Caregivers with identifying specific needs, and barriers to carrying out caregiving responsibilities.

The services are to help meet the needs of the Caregiver and enhance support given to the Care Receiver.

- Case Management for Caregivers
- Respite Services
- Counseling
- Support Groups
- Training / Education
- Information and Referrals
- Supplemental Services

Eligibility:

Caregivers who meet the following criteria are eligible for the National Family Caregiver Support Program Services:

- An adult over the age of 18 and caring for an adult, 60 years or older
- An adult over the age of 18 caring for an individual (any age) with Alzheimer's disease or related disorder
- To be eligible for respite care services the Caregiver must be assisting Care Receiver with two or more Activities of Daily Living/ Instrumental Activities of Daily Living
