Does the Nassau Department of Health require air permits for industrial facilities located in the County of Nassau?

Are boilers exempt from permitting?

Combustion installations where the furnace has a maximum rated (boiler plate) heat input less than 10 million BTU/hr burning fossil fuels (fuel oil or natural gas) are exempt from NYSDEC permitting requirements. How is the quality of the air monitored?

The NYSDEC has ambient air monitoring systems located at Eisenhower Park in Nassau County, and in Babylon and Riverhead located in Suffolk County. These sites monitor for carbon monoxide (CO), Ozone (O3), sulfur dioxide (SO2), inhalable particulates, lead, nitrogen oxide (NO) and nitrogen dioxide (NO2) and the combination of NO and NO2 commonly referred to as NOX.
